

# LONG DISTANCE CALLS

## Types of Calls

**Station-To-Station**—Call station-to-station if you wish to talk with anyone who answers. Rates for calls that you dial yourself are lower than for calls dialed by the operator. Charging begins when the called telephone is answered.

**Person-To-Person**—Call person-to-person when you wish to talk to a particular person or extension number. Tell the operator you wish to make a person-to-person call. Rates are higher than station-to-station and also apply when you talk to an alternate person or extension. Charging starts when conversation begins.

**Bill To Third Number**—Customers may place calls & transfer the charge to another telephone. This service requires operator assistance. The call may be either station-to-station or person-to-person.

**Collect**—You can call collect if the person or firm you are calling agrees to pay the charge. If you want to make a collect call, please be sure to tell the operator when you place the call.

**Telephone Calling Card**—Customers who have telephone calling cards may place calls & charge them to their card number. These calls may require operator assistance to record the calling card number & may be station-to-station or person-to-person. Customers may apply for a calling card by calling their Service Representative.

**Time & Charges**—Customers, when placing calls, may request from the operator the amount of time charged to the call & the cost associated with the call. This service requires operator assistance & the call may be either station-to-station or person-to-person.

**Coin calls**—From coin phones, see instruction card on or near the phone, or dial "OPERATOR."

**Enterprise**—A business may offer its customers in another exchange the privilege of calling by use of a special Enterprise number at their expense. The operator will complete your call if this service is made available in your exchange area.

**Wide Area Telecommunications Service (800 Service)**—Station-to-station long distance calls may be made without charge to you, to those customers who have a wide area telecommunications service. Dial 1 + area code 800 + the special number of customers having this service.

**Conference**—You can talk with several people outside of your local calling area at the same time. Tell the operator you wish to make a conference call. A special charge will be made for this type of call.

**Mobile Calls—Air-Land-Marine**—You can make local and long distance calls to automobiles, trucks, aircraft, boats and ships. Ask the operator for the Mobile, Marine or High Seas Operator. For information on other Communications Common Carriers, consult the Yellow Pages under PAGING & SIGNALING and RADIO-TELEPHONE COMMUNICATIONS headings.

**DIRECT DIAL OVERSEAS CALLS**—Calls to many overseas locations may be direct dialed without operator assistance from certain telephone exchanges. This service provides the fastest, easiest way to call another country. For information about this service in your area, call your Service Representative.

The U.S. and Canada are divided into more than 120 telephone areas. Each area has a 3 figure area code. Your area code is 219 (see map). The area code of the telephone you are calling should be dialed if it is different from the area code of the telephone you are calling. It should not be used if it is the same. (When placing call with operator, say, for example, "I want Area Code 317 555-2384.") When you give someone your telephone number, include your area code if he/she needs it to return your call.—A list of selected area codes is on page 16.
