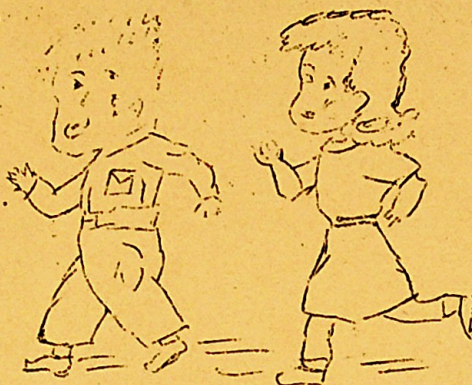
F. F. A.

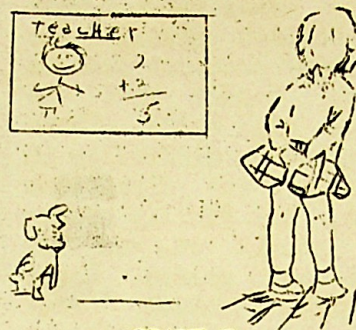

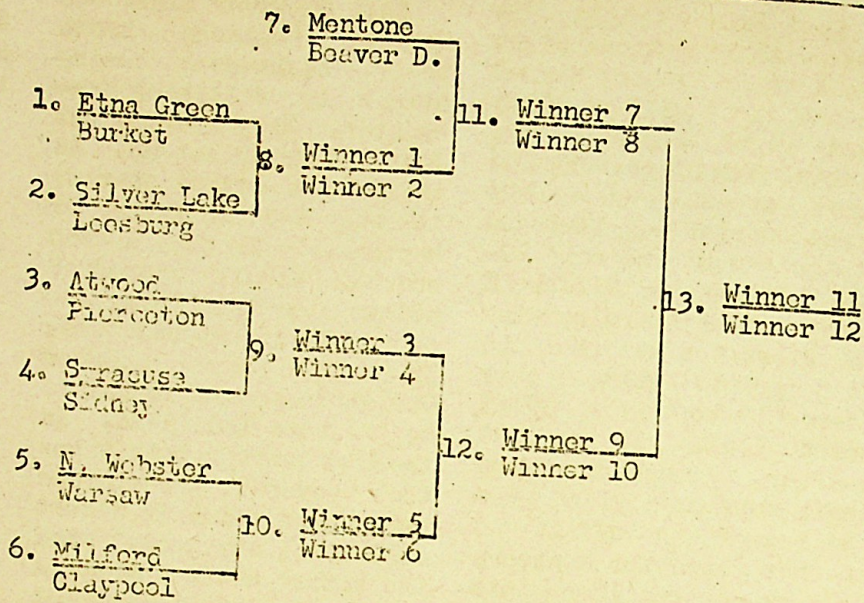
