FLY THE FLAG EVERY DAY

From sunrise to sunset - weather permitting

CORRECT DISPLAY OF THE FLAG

1. Our flag should always have stars to the left of the picture, fabric floating to the right.
2. When hanging with stripes in a vertical position against the wall, the stars should be in the upper left hand corner.
3. When our flag is carried with other flags in parade it should always claim the place of honor - - at the right.
4. When used on a speaker's platform, the flag, if displayed flat should be displayed above and behind the speaker. If flown from a staff, it should be in the position of honor, at the speaker's right. (It should never be used to cover the speaker's desk nor to drape over the front of the platform.)
5. When the flag is displayed over the middle of the street, it should be suspended vertically with the union to the north in an east and west street or to the east in a north and south street.
6. The flag should form a distinctive feature of the ceremony or unveiling of a statue or monument, but it should never be used as the covering for the statue or monument.
7. Do not let the flag touch the ground or the floor, or trail in the water.
8. The flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be destroyed in a dignified way, preferably by burning.
