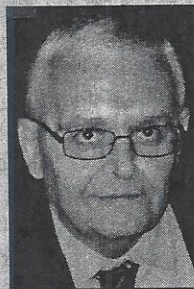

Jack is and will be greatly missed by all who knew him.

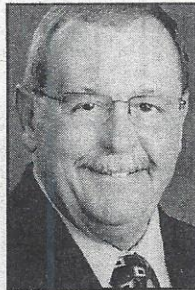
