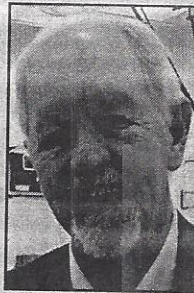
Visitation is scheduled from 5 to 7 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 7, in McHatton-Sadler Funeral Chapel, Warsaw.
