

His wife, Charlotte, photographically recorded nearly all of his restoration projects. One of his restoration projects, a Bantam Jeep, is on display in a Pittsburg area museum. The automobile club he was most closely connected to was the American Austin and Bantam Car Club.

The full life that he was able to live for the 40 years after he lost his eyesight can be summed up in one word: Charlotte. When she passed in 2009, he felt he had lost his eyesight for a second time.

On the afternoon of his passing, he was not respondent to either voice or touch but was calm and peaceful. In an attempt to connect with him, his favorite hymn was played for him, "How Great Thou Art." He passed away as George Beverly Shea sang.
