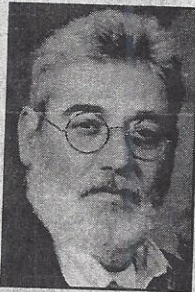

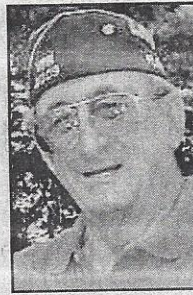
He was preceded in death by his parents; wife; a granddaughter, Anna Proietti; and a brother, Archimedes Proietti.

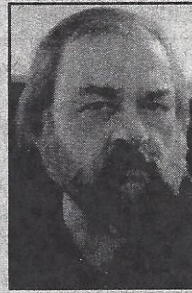

James A. "Jim" Priser, 61, passed away unexpectedly at 1:32 p.m. Oct. 31, 2016, in Lutheran Hospital, Fort Wayne, while surrounded by his family.



He was born Jan. 13, 1955, in Warsaw, to James M. and Shirley Harmon Priser. He married Sally Hogan on June 11, 1977, in Warsaw.

He was a 1973 graduate of Warsaw Community High School, and attended classes at Nikon Photography

The lifetime Warsaw resident was maintenance supervisor at Dalton Foundries; owner of Lake City Arms and Jim Priser Photography; and was a pioneer for digitizing photography, which included the creation of GIF and JPG files. His photography has been featured in Sports Illustrated, JPL, NASA and Microsoft.
