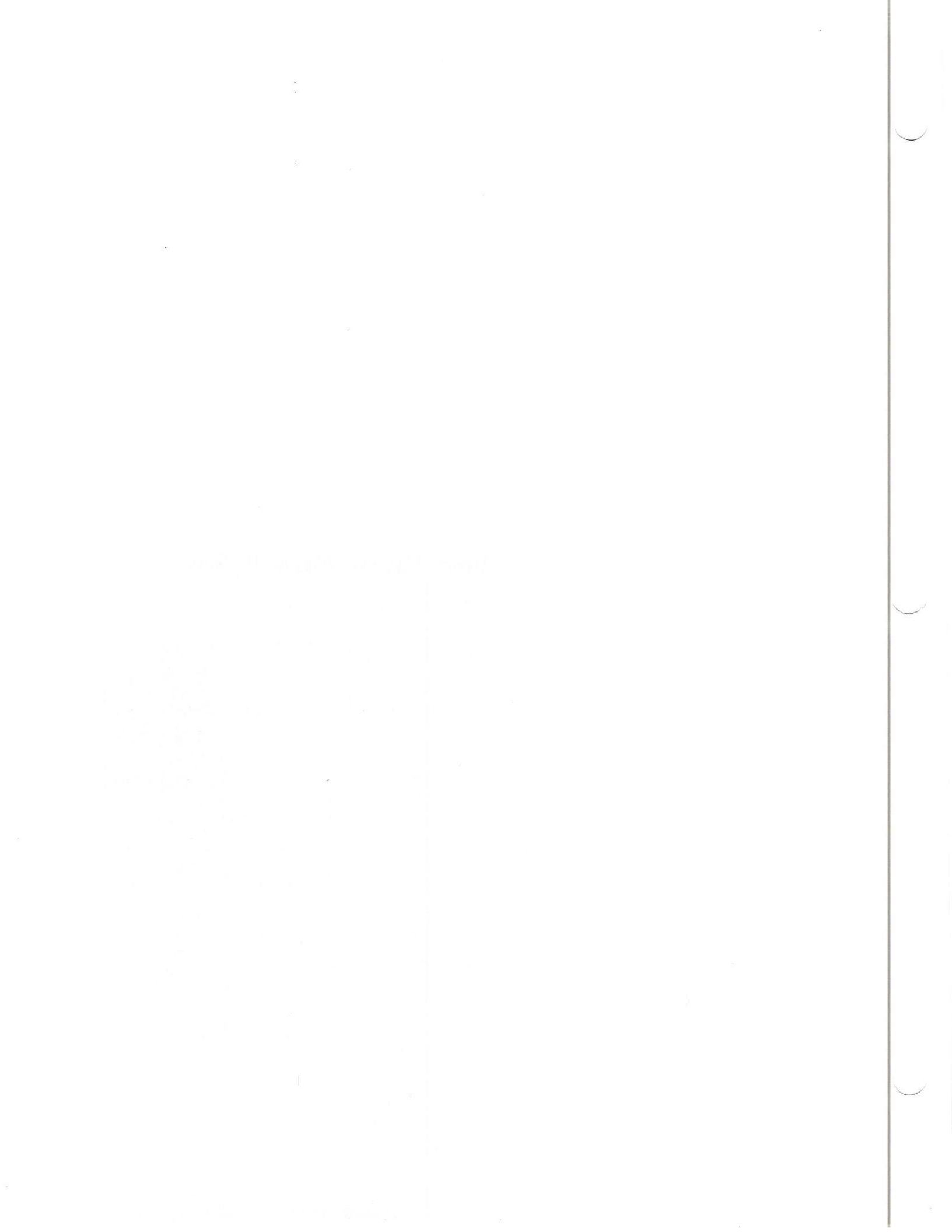

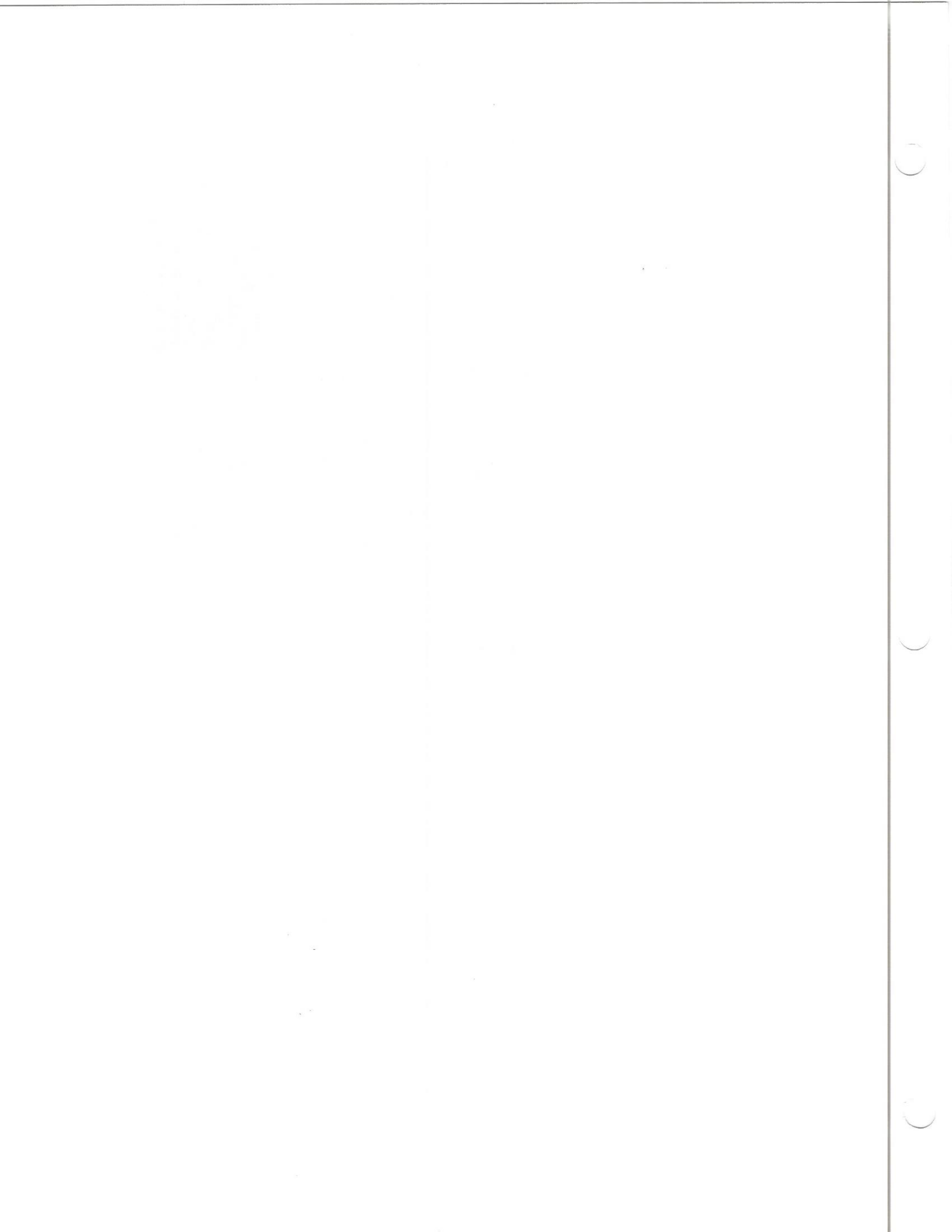

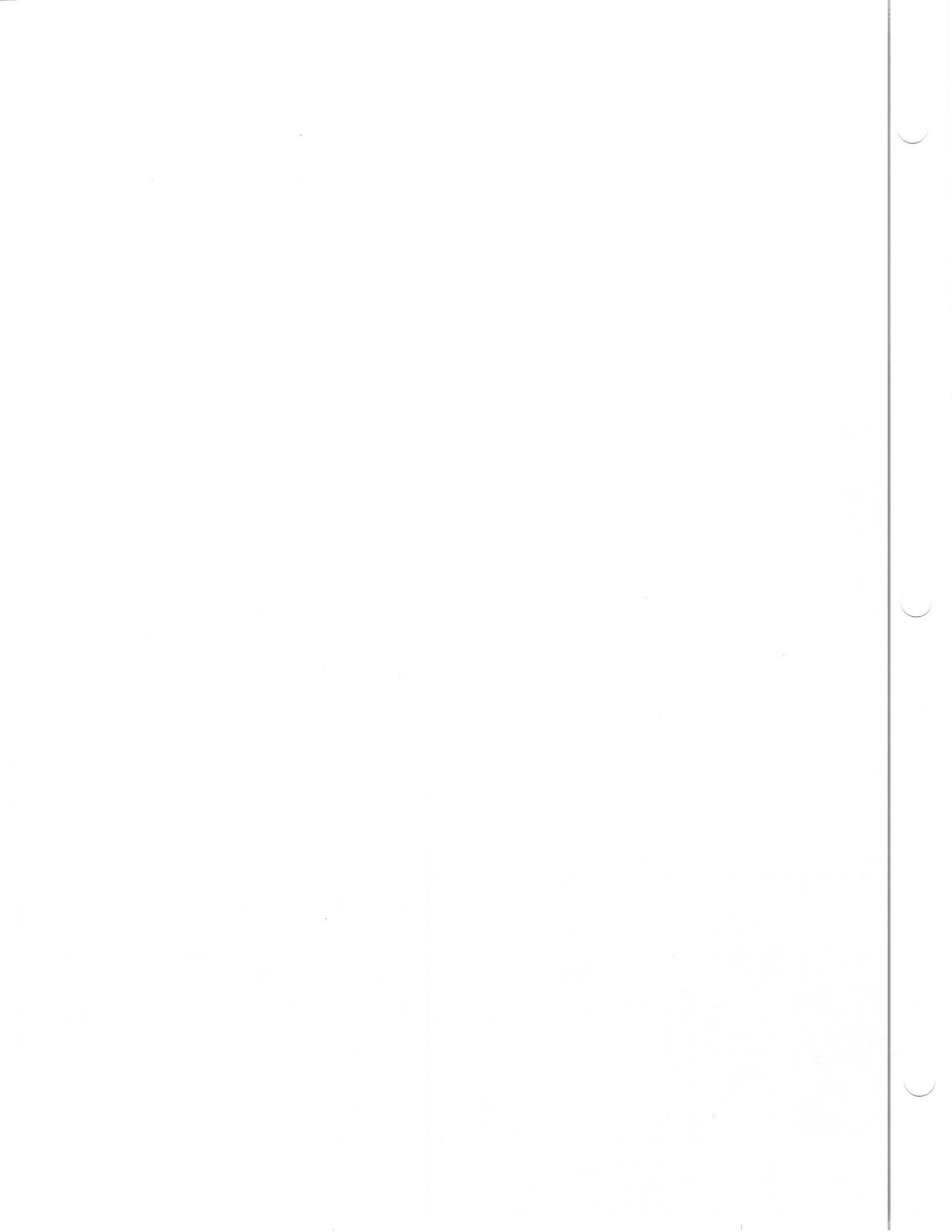
Stuart was preceded in death by his father, William Savage, and his wife, Laura (Mosbaugh) Savage.

of all, Stuart loved life; he loved laughter. Stuart will be missed by many.

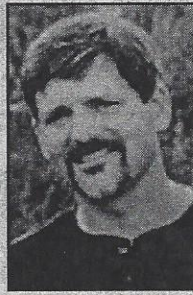
