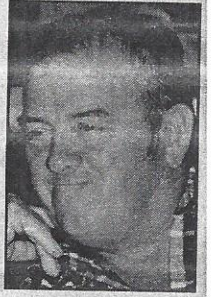

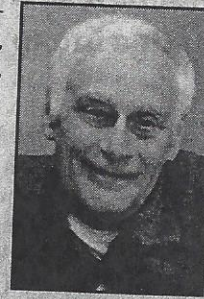

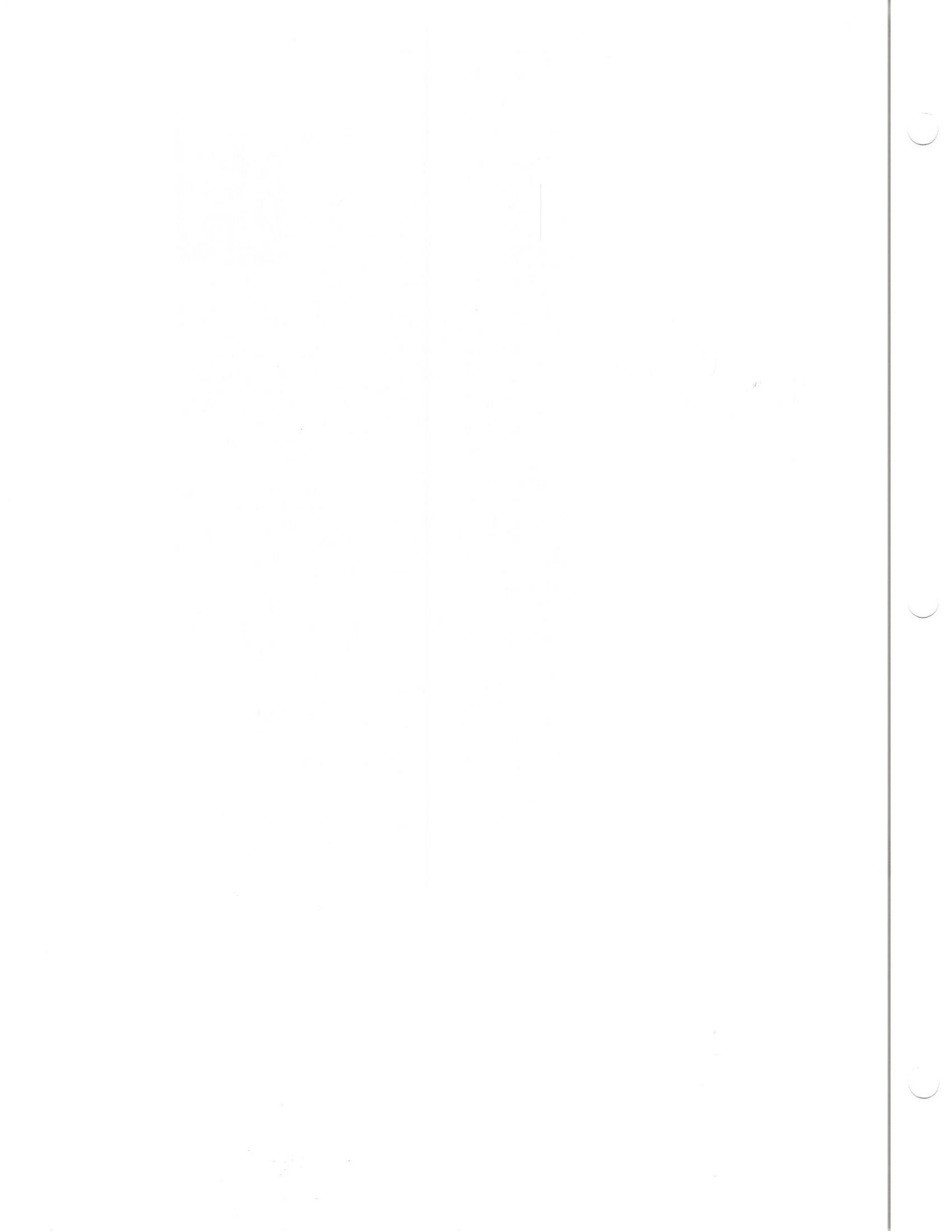

He was a carpenter, building houses around Tippy Lake and North Manchester. He had also worked for Foster Forbes Glass, Marian, for several years.

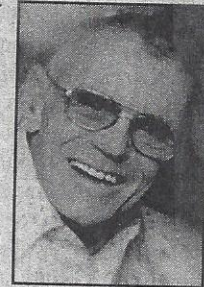

In addition to her husband, Junior Shirey, those who preceded Marilyn in passing include her son, Randy Shirey; brother, Don Anderson; and her parents.

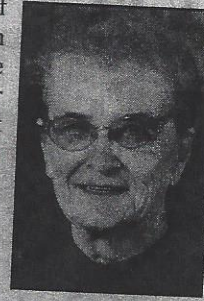

She was an avid crafter, specializing in crochet and beadwork. She enjoyed displaying her talents at craft shows and in craft shops.

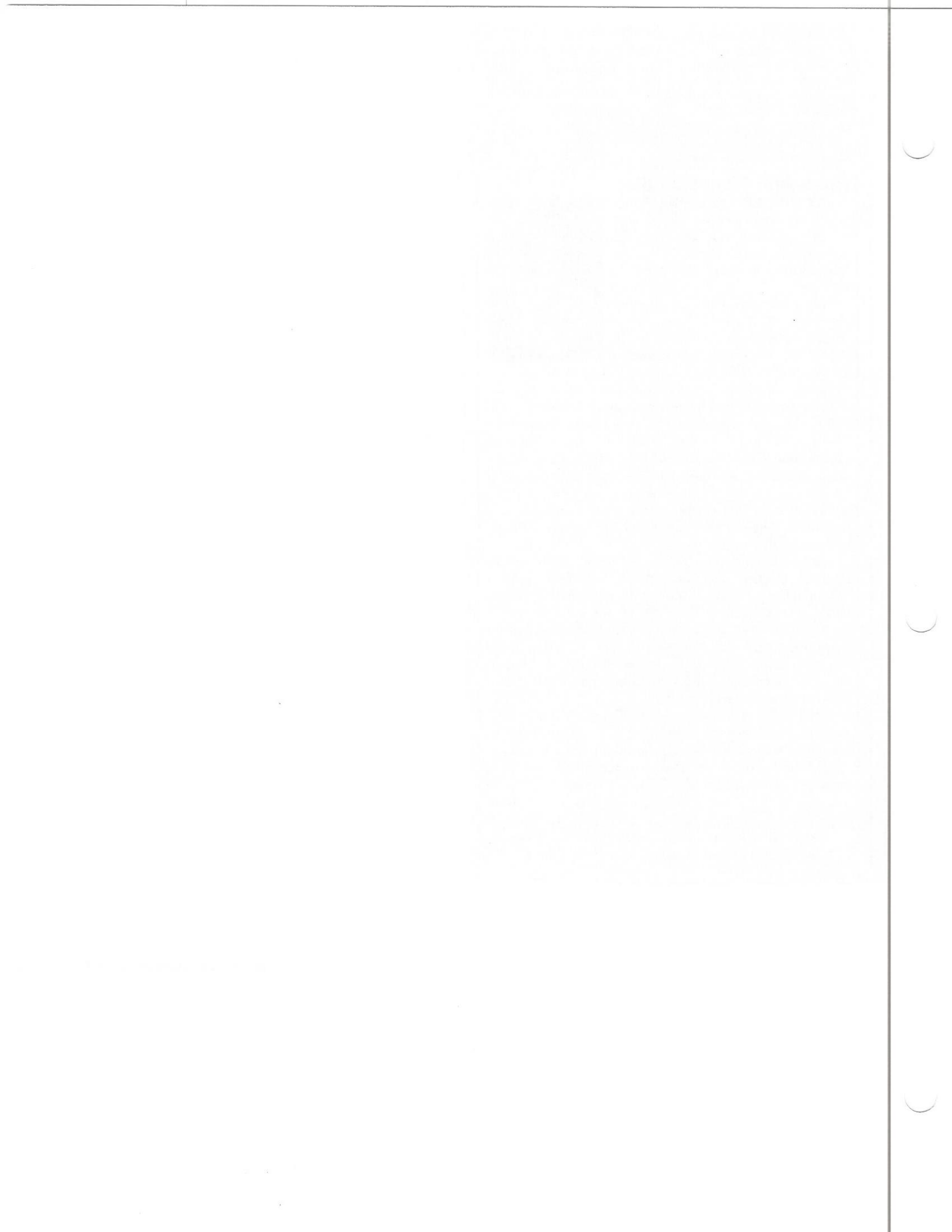

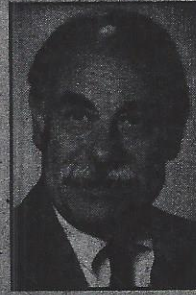

A graveside service will be at 2 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 7, at Oakwood Cemetery, 421 N. Maple Ave., Warsaw.

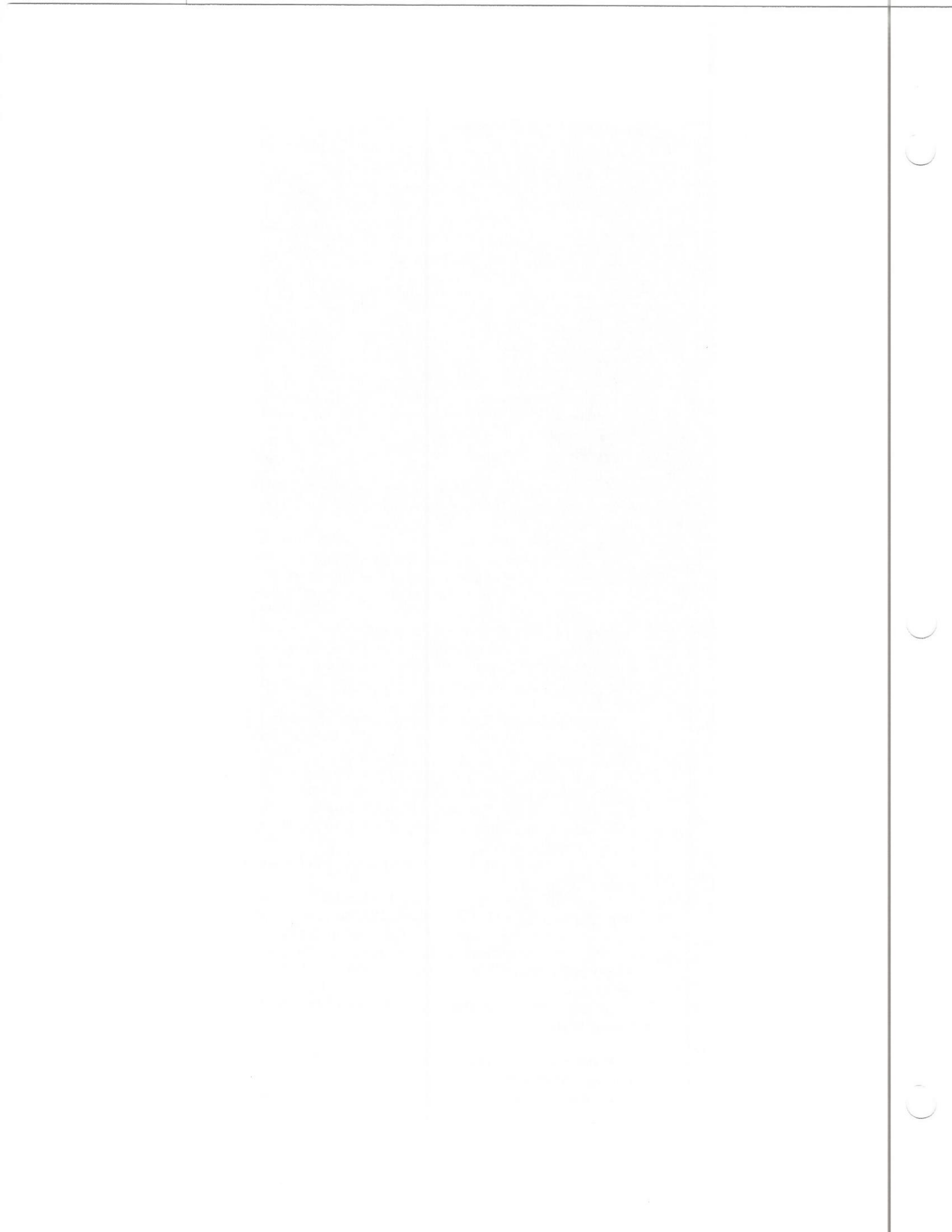

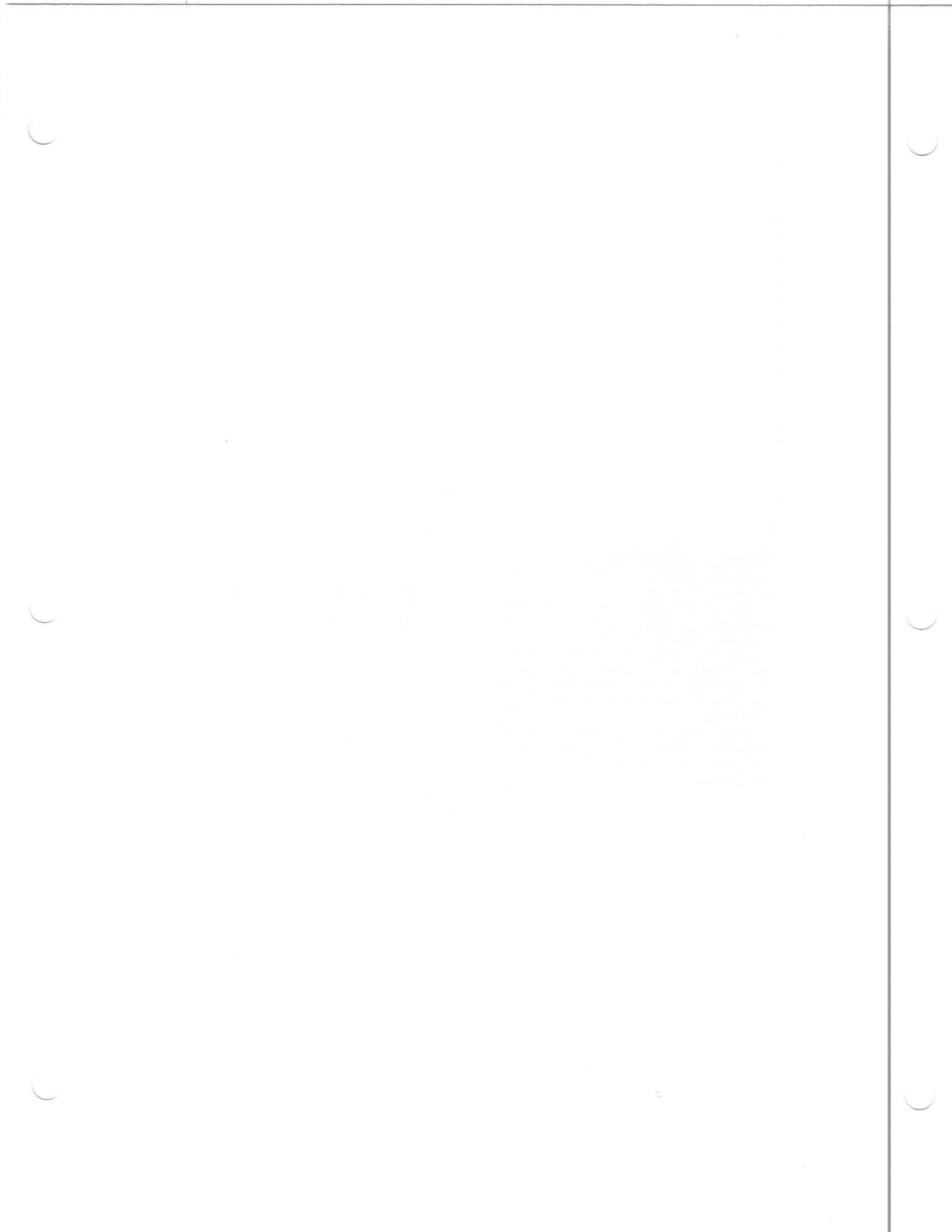

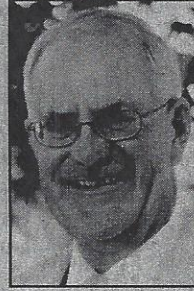


## Mark A. Slabaugh

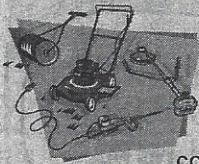

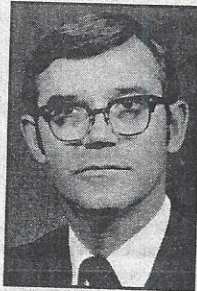
