She is survived by her son, Mark Smith, Claypool.

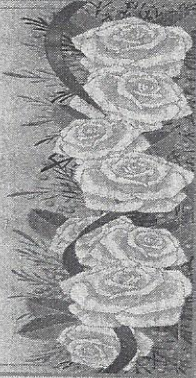

Local attorney Scott Andrew Smith, 44, Warsaw, passed away Oct. 2, 2015, in a single-engine plane crash on the South Carolina side of Lake Hartwell in Oconee County.

He was killed in a plane crash en route to the Notre Dame vs. Clemson football game as he was an avid Notre Dame fan.

He was born Sept. 11, 1971, in Plymouth, to the late Charles D. Smith and Rebecca "Becky" Anne Williams Smith, who survives in Mentone.

He was a 1990 graduate of Tippecanoe Valley High School. He attended Warner University in Lake Wales, Fla., where he received his bachelor's degree in accounting in 1996. While there, he played basketball for Warner University and was their team captain for two years. He was a 2000 graduate of Valparaiso University School of Law. He obtained licenses to practice in the Indiana Supreme Court, United States District Court for the Northern District of Indiana and United States District for the Southern District of Indiana. 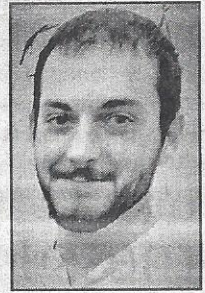

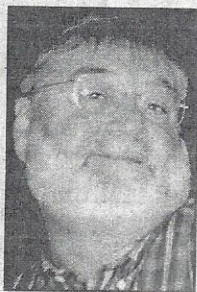
