

No. 1 is aerial view f Hobart Creighton farm showing hatch-ny-office building, dwelling, 4 houses U.S. Certified matings, 2 houses special R.O.P. matings, 1½ mi. south of Atwood.

No. 2 is Russell Creighton farm on U.S. No. 30. We see the dwelling and farm, and in the background, 7 of our laying houses; two of them are specially equipped to house the 4,300 pullets in trapnest as R.O.P. candidates.

No. 3 is "Mulberry Hill" farm, 1½ miles west of Atwood on U.S. 30, housing 10,000 layers.

Each year we brood 100,000 of our own U.S. Certified and U.S. R.O.P. chicks to fill our laying houses. Interior view of one of our 2,000 pullet capacity houses is shown above. Scores of successful poultry keepers have purchased Creighton chicks and used Creighton ideas for the designing of their laying houses and care of their birds for greater production.



It takes 15,000 pounds of feed for our 60,000 Leghorns on a winter day. The above illustrated 12-ton semi-outfit came in from Illinois with a load of shelled corn. This is unloaded directly into bins. Yes, we have an army of productive hers.

U.S. Certified Chicks

These chicks are from carefully selected layers mated to R.O.P. approved male birds from dams laying over 250 eggs. All parent stock is bloodtested by the whole blood stained antigen method by our own employees, supervised by the official state agency of the National Poultry Improvement Plan.

Pedigreed Pullet Mating Chicks

Each layer is wing-banded, and was hatched from our U.S. R.O.P. matings of last year. These layers are carefully selected pullets of good body type, and trapnested every day under supervision of the Indiana R.O.P. Breeders' Association, and are mated to R.O.P. males from hens laying over 275 eggs. An excellent mating from which to get foundation stock.

100% Live Delivery Guaranteed. Transportation paid on baby chicks.

Chick orders are entered in rotation as received. When our capacity is booked, "why there aren't any more" and deposits are refunded

U.S. R.O.P. Chicks


These are our best matings. All birds in these matings are in pens containing one male and about 20 hens. The male birds are the best we have on the farm, and the hens were trapped in their pullet year under the supervision of the Indiana R.O.P. Breeders' Association.

All hens laid over 200 eggs in their pullet year. These birds, now from two to five years old, are divided into pens according to their family history and egg production. All the chicks produced from these pens are individually pedigreed, and all eggs marked for hatching in pedigree baskets. We, of course, offer chicks from these matings in limited numbers, but they are what you want for good cockerels, or layers to serve as foundation stock for a breeding program.


The male birds used in these matings epresent the very finest birds we have. Many of mese males have been progeny-tested and the oners are for progeny-tested dams and sires.
