



Northern Kosciusko County Agricultural Self-Guided Tour

Kosciusko County is rich in its agricultural base. It consistently ranks in the top three counties in the State of Indiana in total agricultural production. The agriculturalists want to share part of this wealth with the visitors through the agricultural tour. Some places you may tour by appointment and others you may only drive by. Both agricultural tours were prepared by Phil and Marianne Smith.

Site #1 Begin your tour by heading Non Lake St. from the W side of the County Courthouse. Continue N on Lake St. This turns into Old Rd. 30, as you drive out of the City of Warsaw. About 4 mi. out of town and at the intersection of Old Rd 30 and CR 350W, you will encounter the Creighton Brother's Feed Mill. This feed mill receives, dries and stores over 60,000 tons of corn and other ingredients annually. Guided tours by appointment, 267-3103.

THE ETNA BANK

Site #2 Continue along Old Rd 30 through the town of Atwood and turn N (right) onto CR 800W and travel across US 30 to view the Pickin' Patch, a U-Pick Farm. This two-family owned operation has an annual output of over 100 tons of fruit and vegetables. Guided tours by appointment, 858-7781.

Site #3 Head N of CR 800W until it intersects with CR 700N to view the Truex Farm. Drive by the farm that is home to 75,000 caged layer chickens. Featured on the tour by Purdue University which hosted the first delegation from the People's Republic of China, this farm is a must-see for all county residents and visitors. Drive by only.

Site #4 Continue a bit farther N on CR 800W and turn E (right) onto CR 900N to view the Lowell Anglin Farm on CR 900N between CR 625W and CR 700W. The Anglin farm specializes in soybeans, wheat, corn and hogs. There are 36 acres of beans, 40 acres of wheat, 410 acres of corn and 400-600 hogs. Drive by only.

Site #5 Continue driving E on CR 900N and turn S (right) onto CR 425W. This intersects with CR 800N. Turn E (left) onto it and then turn S (right) onto CR 400W. Turn E (left) onto CR 600N to drive by the Clunette Elevator. This 32-year-old family feed mill specializes in feed grain and fertilizers. It is the largest Master Mix (Central Soya) dealer in Indiana and Michigan. Drive by only.

Site #6 Continue E on CR 600N to the intersection of CR 150W to drive by the family owned Ferguson Farm. Over 11,000 ducks are started and sold every week. Over 125 tons of feed, and two semi-loads of wood shavings for bedding are used weekly. Drive by only.

Site #7 Continue along CR 600N to SR 15. Turn N (left) and pass Polk & Son's Farm Implement dealer, rumored to be the largest farm implement dealer in the mid-west. Their two annual auctions draw nation wide. Drive by only.

Site #8 Turn W (left) from SR 15 onto CR 700N to CR 100W. Turn N (right) onto 100W to the intersection CR 700N, Summy Rd. This is Stookey Holsteins, Inc. They specialize in dairy breeding for the exportation of fresh and frozen embryo sales. The annual gross sales of 5 million speaks of its success. Guided tours by appointment, 453-3602.

Site #9 Continue W on Summy Road and turn N (right) onto CR 200W. Turn E (right) onto CR 800N to SR 15. Head N on SR 15 to CR 900N. Between CR 900N and CR 1000N on the W side of the road is the Harold Miller Farm. The family owned farm specializes in spearmint (50 acres) and corn (350 acres). Mint distilling takes place from about July 10 to August 10. Tours are available by appointment during this time. John Borntrager, 658-4428 or H. Miller, 658-9115. As

you drive by on SR 15, you will notice the bending trees. These were planted to prevent wind and soil erosion, which is why they are bending.

Site #10 Continue N on SR 15 to enter the town of Milford. On the N side of the town is Chore Time Equipment and Brock Manufacturing on both sides of SR 15. Chore Time manufactures and markets world wide poultry, swine, and dairy cow feeding and ventilation systems. Brock makes feed bins and grain storage bins that are distributed worldwide. Brock sells more feed bins than any other company in the world. This is the headquarters for both companies. Guided tours are available for groups with farm interests, call John Replogle, 658-4191, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m.

Site #11 Continue a bit farther on SR 15 on the left side of the road, drive by the Ralston Purina Feed Plant.

Site #12 Turn E (right) onto CR 1350N and immediately turn S (right) onto the Old State Rd. Continue S and turn E (left) onto Bear Road. Turn N (left) onto CR 175E. Turn E (right) onto CR 1300N and continue to CR 300E to view the Maple Leaf Feed Mill. This mill produces 75,000 tons of feed each year using 12,000 acres of corn and 25,000 acres of soybeans.

Site #13 Continue E on CR 1300N to SR 13. Turn S (right). Continue on SR 13S and turn W (right) onto CR 1000N. 3/4 mi. down the road stop by the Grady Farm. This third generation farm specializes in cattle feeding. They have a volume of 2,000 head per year. Tour by appointment, 457-5381 or 457-2952.

Site #14 Continue W on CR 1000N to CR 300R. Turn S (left) onto CR 300E. Continue S and turn W (right) onto CR 900N. At the intersection of CR 200E turn S (left) to see Maple Leaf Farms, Inc. This is the world's largest producer of ducklings. Maple Leaf products are sold in stores and restaurants in all 50 states and various foreign countries. Duckling feathers and down is an important by-product. Through affiliated companies, over 3 million pounds of feathers and down are marketed each year.

The tour route covers over 200 miles throughout the county. Many historical spots have been mentioned, however there are many that we could not list here. This selfguided tour allows you to see our beautiful countryside, discover potential recreation areas, and most importantly, to learn more about our history and our Hoosier heritage.

The tour was developed by the Kosciusko County Historical Society and researched by N. Pauline Jordan, Acquisition Chairperson and members of the Society.

Site #1 Start your historical tour with the town of Warsaw, the county seat. Begin at the recently renovated County Courthouse located on the Courthouse square, bordered by Main, Lake, Center and Buffalo Streets in the downtown. The majestic three-story stone building was built in 1884.

Site #2 Continue your tour by going one block east on Main Street to the former County Jail. Built in 1870, the building was recently adapted to house the Warsaw Museum and Genealogical Library.

Site #3 Just north of the Warsaw Museum is Center Lake Park. In addition to taking advantage of the sun and water, visit the City Pavilion. This is a restored building from the 1930's.

Site #4 Follow Canal Street east to Detroit St or Hwy 15 turn S four blocks to see the rumored operator of the underground slave movement which is now the Christian Science Church.

Site #5 Continue S past Center St., Market St., and Winona Ave., to stop off at the Warsaw Cut Glass Factory for a tour of the facility. Tours for small groups are available. Tours for a large group are available by appointment.

Box 377 Warsaw, Indiana 267-8196 **Site #6** Stay on Detroit Street and head N to Winona Ave. Turn left onto Winona Ave., go through one stop light and turn N (right) onto Lake Street for one block to visit the old Penn Railroad Station. The old station is now a business and is being restored.

Site #7 Continue on Lake Street another block and stop to visit the old Post Office which now houses the Counting House Bank. During the conversion from Post Office to bank, the building was totally restored.

Site #8 Follow Lake Street north out of the town of Warsaw. The road bends and heads west. Approximately 3½ miles, on your left, you will encounter the old Iron Bridge on the Tippecanoe River. The bridge once divided Chief Mota's reservation to the west and Chief Checase's reservation to the east.

Site #9 Walk just south of the bridge to find the original Yellowstone Trail that went from coast to coast during the pioneer days.

Site #10 Continue visiting historical Kosciusko County as you drive west on Old Road 30W into Atwood. From the road you can see the Atwood Methodist Church built in 1866, the United Brethren Church built in 1887, and the Grade School built in 1878, which cost \$1575 to construct.

Site #11 Visit the town of Etna Green next as you continue your journey westward on Old US 30W. The only town in the nation by this name, the main business is the Etna Green Elevator, constructed in 1852. In 1976, the state named Etna Green a centennial town. In 1953, when the town celebrated their centennial, the Etna Green School was considered one of the leading schools in the state. Today this is Heritage Park.

Site #12 Turn S (left) onto SR 19 and follow it to the town of Mentone, "The Egg Basket of the Midwest." Turn E (left) onto Hwy 25 and see the large white egg, weighing 3000 lbs, as you drive down Main Street. The egg was built in 1946 to advertise the Egg Festival.



Site #13 Stop off at the Lawrence D. Bell Museum, just south of Hwy 25 next to the City Park. The Mentone officials dedicated this aircraft museum in June of 1982. Located at 306 N. Broadway in downtown

Mentone is the Bell Memorial Library.

Site #14 Traveling eastward from Mentone on SR 25, visit Palestine, now almost a deserted village. On the eastern outskirt of the town, take time to walk through the old country church and cemetery, shadows of remnants past. Just a little way south of the church was the site of the old mill and dam.

Site #15 Turning S (right) onto 600W from SR 25, you will wander through the southwestern part of our county seeing such communities as Burket, Sevastopol, Yellow Creek, and Beaver Dam. This is beautiful country. Turning E (left) onto SR 14 and traveling about 3 miles you will reach Silver Lake. Walk through this small community and visit the old stores and Post Office.

Site #16 Head north out of Silver Lake on Hwy 15. About 11/2 miles stop to tour the Claypool Sale Barn. Over 5 million dollars worth of livestock are sold yearly through the auctions.

Site #17 Continue north on SR 15 from the Sale Barn, you will next encounter the town of Claupool. Turn E (right) onto Rd 700S to see the many old buildings constructed from native timber from the turn of the century as you drive by the farms and the downtown.

Site #18 Continue on CR 700S to the Packertown Rd and then turn S (right). You will next see the town of Packerton. About 1890, Packerton was a village of perhaps 500 people.

Site #19 Just past Packerton, turn E (left) onto 900S. For about 10 miles to reach Sidney. Drive by the old Elementary School and visit the general store and

Site #20 Traveling north from Sidney on SR 13, stop off in Pierceton to shop in the many antique and general stores. While walking through the downtown area, see the many architectural historical remnants as well as the old train depot in the town park. Many young men from this area served in the Civil War and today this town has an active American Legion Post.

Site #21 Continue north along SR 13 past the Barbee Lakes and Kuhn Lake. Turn W (left) onto 500N (Armstrong Rd.). Follow this road into Oswego on the banks of the Tippecanoe River. Oswego was originally part of Chief Musquabuck's village. Turning right on one of the side roads, you can see Tippecanoe Lake, the deepest natural lake in the state. Visit the general store, the oldest commercial building in the county. Stop off at the Post Office which was built in 1838. Visit the first Kosciusko County Historical Museum. The building was given to the Historical Society by Mr. and Mrs. Harold Pound. The first season opened in June of 1972 and is open to the public through the summer months every Sunday afternoon.

Site #22 Returning to SR 13 and turning north via 500N, you will pass Clarksville and the one room school house restored by the retired teachers group on the W (left) side of the road. On the east side of the road, down by Lake Webster, the old paddle wheel is still alive. The 54-year-old Dixie tours the lake during the

Site #23 Continuing north on SR 13, wander into the days of King Arthur's Camelot in North Webster. Taking on Camelot architecture, the town features include the International Palace of Sports Hall of Fame and Museum and several unique store fronts. The Whitefront grocery is a fine example of 1840's Greek revival architecture.

Site #24 Traveling north on SR 13, you will pass Epworth Forest Park on the E (right). This is a Methodist Church Camp which has been in existence for many, many years. Further north on the right you will see the sign to the Tri-County Fish and Wildlife Area. This area

covers 3,400 acres extending into Noble County and including the wildlife sanctuary. You will next view the national marker (sign) marking the Continental Divide. "This divide separates the Great Lakes drainage system from the Mississippi River drainage system."

Site #25 To the east from SR 13 is Lake Wawasee. About 1900, Nine Mile Lake was changed to Wawasee Lake. Colonel Eli Lilly renamed the lake. This is Indiana's largest natural lake and covers 3,060 acres and cuts 77 feet deep. Traveling Route #8 and SR 13A, the site of the Wawasee Inn was undoubtedly the eastern terminus of the old Indian Trail, which led from what is now called Greider's Landing across the sandbar to Ogden Island and then to the point on the mainland. From this elevated point, war-smokes and scouts undoubtedly made their observations and plans known to their tribe, the Pottawatomies.


Site #26 Coming into Syracuse from the east sides of Syracuse and Wawasee Lakes, you will see the Syracuse Library founded in October, 1908. You will also pass Pickwick Block. This block was destroyed by fire three different times, 1901, 1940, and 1960. It was rebuilt each time. Church organizations have had their camps in this community for many years. Oakwood Park among them.

Site #27 Turn W (left) onto CR 1300N as you leave Syracuse to travel onto Milford. This comment was made of Milford in 1887, "Milford is today one of the prettiest towns in the county, with a population of 600. The modern appearance of its residences and substantial business buildings gives it an air of freshness and a large retail trade is done here." In the editorial pages of the Times on January 31, 1983 - "Action at Milford communities everywhere both large and small are surely watching enviously the things that Milford is doing."

Site #28 Continue your historical tour south on SR 15S to Leesburg. Leesburg is the oldest town in the county at 150 years. In 1835, Levi Lee laid out the town and the first judicial court, schoolhouse, religious meeting place, store, steamflour mill and post office in the county. Near 1854, Leesburg diminished in commercial activities.

Site #29 Continue south on SR 15 to 400N. Turn W (right) to Monouquet. This is located on a former Indian village. Once a prosperous town, only a few hints of wealth remain.

Site #30 Continue on SR 15 into Warsaw. Turn E (left) onto Winona Avenue to Winona Lake, the world-renowned religious sanctuary. Formerly occupied by Indians, Winona Lake is now the home of the world's largest Bible conference. Walk along Park Avenue and see the Rodeheaver Auditorium and the Billy Sunday Tabernacle.

Trail #2 Center Lake to Fox Farm Park. Avg. est. time: 1 - 1½ hours. Enter canal near Minor Addition. Turn left at Lones Ditch. Do not turn right at Tippecanoe River. Go down Tippecanoe River to the Fox Farm Park. Heavy lilies in areas. Only one portage. Some shallow waters.

Trail #3 Fox Farm Park to Tippecanoe Rest Park. Avg. est. time: 1 - 1½ hours. From Fox Farm Park travel down the Tippecanoe River to the Tippecanoe Rest Park. Several fallen logs. Most can be maneuvered without portaging. Some spots very shallow. This trail may be combined with Trail #2.

Trail #4 Oswego to Center Lake Park. Avg. est. time: 6 · 8 hours. Stretch "A" enter Tippecanoe River by bridge and gas station on Armstrong Rd. Go down stream to intersection of Rds 450N & 100E. (2 · 2½ hours)

Stretch "B" from Roads 450N & 100E, continue until you reach Valley Springs. Some trees are down. (2 - 21/2 hours).

Stretch "C" from Valley Springs head toward Center Lake via Lones Ditch. (It is also possible to go to Pike Lake from here.) Largest portage at Tippecanoe dam. Several rest areas around. (2 · 2½ hours)

Trail #5 Little Chapman Lake to Pike Lake Park. Avg. est. time: 3 · 4 hours. Enter Little Chapman Lake (or cross Big Chapman) start into Heetler's Ditch near lilies and the old dam. First portage 75-100 yards next portage at Beaver Dam. Creek widens a little. Portage number 3 at underwater fence. Good rest area. Pass under Rd 175N in about 1 hour from start. Logs jammed Beaver Dam. Cross carefully. Keep right on Deed's Creek. Go under Rd 175E (Culvert). Carefully cross or pass beneath a low foot bridge. A hole in a picket fence allows passage near farm. Go under Rd 100 (about 2 hours from start). Go under US 30. Cross concrete dam at canal on Pike Lake and head for Pike Lake boat ramp. End. Many shallows, rock piles, & log iams to cross. Very strenuous. Recommended for experienced canoers.

Palestine Lake

East of SR 25. Gain access on a state owned ramp on the NW corner. Ice fishing. Largemouth bass on the 290 acre lake.

W of SR 15S onto CR 1300S. Bluegill, crappie, bass & perch. County owned easement on east shore

Silver Lake

NW of the town of Silver Lake. A privately owned ramp is available to launch boats from the east side of the lake. Bluegills, bass, pike & perch fishing.

CR 600W & CR 850S. Launch from a privately owned ramp on the N shore or a county owned access on the S shore. Check with Shank's Resort, 491-3572.

Southern Kosciusko County Agricultural Self Guided Tour

Site #1 Begin the southern Kosciusko County agricultural tour by heading S on Buffalo St. from the SE corner of the courthouse. Turn W (right) onto SR 25 (Winona Ave.). Continue W on SR 25. When SR 25 turns S you continue straight - this is now Crystal Lake Rd. At the intersection of CR 650W, about 4 mi., you will see Crystal Lake Egg products. This facility processes over 18 million cases or 551 million dozen eggs annually for restaurants, hospitals and grocery stores. Guided tours are available by appointment, 858-2514. **Site** #2 Turn S onto CR 650W. About 3/4 mi. you will pass one of the Creighton Brothers' commercial egg laying operations. There are over 325,000 laying hens.

Drive by only.

Site #3 Continue S on CR 650W and turn W (right) onto CR 100S. Continue on CR 100S and turn S (left) onto SR 19. Continue on SR 19 into Mentone. When SR 19 makes a sharp turn, turn S (right) onto Elm St. to see the Cargill-Nutrena Feed Company. They supply over 45,000 tons of feed for swine, dairy, pountry and beef annually. Drive by only.

Sites #4 & #5 Elm St. turns into Jackson St. which intersects with SR 19. Take SR 19 S a few blocks and then turn E (left) onto SR 25. Just outside of Mentone turn N (left) onto CR 950W. Continue N on CR 950W and turn E (right) onto CR 300S (Shilling Rd.) Just past CR 900W on the N side of the road you will see the Creighton Brothers' beef cow herd. On the other side you will see the Steve Lewis hog and grain farm. They buy over 4,000 feeder pigs and raise them for market. At the time of market they weigh 220-230 lbs. Both are drive by only.

Site #6 Continue heading E on CR 300S and turn S (right) onto CR 700W. Turn W (right) onto SR 25. Continue on SR 25 and turn S (left) onto CR 900W. At

the intersection of CR 900W and CR 500S view the Wayside Farm. This family operation has registered Hampshire sheep. Sheep from this farm have been shown at the Chicago International and the Indiana and Illinois State Fairs. Drive by only.

Site #7 Turn E (left) onto CR 500S. Continue through Burket to CR 600W. Turn S (right) onto CR 600W and 1/4 mi. view the McSherry Farm. This farm deals in grain and hogs. There are over 1200 acres of beans, wheat and corn. About 150 sows, 1400 hogs and 800 feeder pigs are marketed annually. Drive by only.

Site #8 Continue S on CR 600W. Turn E (left) onto CR 600S. Follow this and turn N (left) onto CR 450 W. Continue N about 1½ mi. and turn E (right) onto CR 450S (Ford Rd.) about 1½ mi. view the Maple Shade Farm. This farm deals in grain and livestock. Former crops included tomatoes, popcorn, pickles and pumpkins. Today, the farm has an output of 100,000 bushels of corn, 25,000 of soybeans and 10,000 of wheat. Over 200 head of cattle are marketed yearly. Drive by only.

Site #9 Continue on CR 450S and turn S (right) onto SR 15. Continue S on SR 15. Just N of the Claypool overpass on the W (right) side of the road is the Hooley Farm. This family owned dairy farm has registered Holstein cattle. Milk is also produced from about 60 cows. Drive by only.

Site #10 Continuing S on SR 15 on the E (left) side of the road you will see a ceramic cow. This is the Jualmi Farm. The Jualmi Farm has shown many national award winning dairy (Guernsey) cows. Jualmi Farm is the home of the 1982 national Tarbell trophy winner, Cornell Choice Jewel. This award is given to the highest producers of butterfat in the nation. Jewell's record was 30,380 lbs. of milk and 1562 lbs. of fat as a junior four-year-old. Guided tours by appointment, 566-2594.



Site #11 Continue S on SR 15. On the E (left) side of the road just past CR 900S you will see Tri-State Harvestore Systems, Inc. This corporation retails forage and grain structures, liquid manure management systems, automated feeding equipment for hogs, beef and dairy animals. Sales area covers 49 counties in northern Indiana. There is a complete display of automatic feeding equipment. Guided tours by appointment, 352-2181.

Site #12 Just past Tri-State Harvestore turn W (right) onto CR 950S. The third house on the south side is the Carl Sands and Sons, Inc. This family owned operation deals in hogs and grain. Over 150 sows farrow every six weeks. The farm has over 1000 head in the finishing house. Guided tours by appointment, 352-2694.

Site #13 Turn S (left) from CR 950S onto CR 450W. The last house on the E (left) side is the Park View Farm. This farm deals in dairy-livestock-Holsteins. There is a 10-stall milking parlor, a Harvestore automatic feeder system, two calf barns, and a confinement building. Over 2 million dollars in sales annually. Guided tours by appointment, 352-2112.

Site #14 Turn E (left) from CR 450W onto SR 14 (CR 1100S). Continue on SR 14 through Silver Lake. About 5 blocks past the intersection of SR 15 you will see the Supreme Farmstead Equipment Co. This is a distributor, wholesaler and manufacturer of Farmstead material handling equipment and silo accessories. Drive by only.

Site #15 A few blocks further you will see the Miller & Son's Structures, Inc. They manufacture confinement chicken and hog houses. They handle equipment for the above plus grain storage. Tours by appointment, 352-2166, Larry Rhoades, Dick Dial or Tony Fleckenstein.

Site #16 Continue on SR 14. Turn S (right) onto CR 100W. 1/2 mi. S, the first place on the E (left) side of the road is the Don Walther Farm. This farm specializes in



beef cattle, grain and hay. There is an annual output of 300 head of cattle, 160 acres of corn, 85 acres of wheat, 45 acres of hay and 100 acres of soybeans. Drive by onlu.


Site #17 Continuing to the intersection of CR 1200S you will see the Swihart Grain Co. This partnership specializes in grain and the hauling of duck feed. This company buys grain from the farmers and hauls all feed for the Maple Leaf duck growing houses. Drive by onlu.

Site #18 Turn E (left) onto CR 1200S, then turn S (right) onto County Farm Road. About 1/4 mi. you will find the Pine-Ayr Farm. This farm deals in Ayrshire dairy farming. They have over 65 milking cows, an automated feeding system and 400 farming acres. Red and white Ayrshire cows are not plentiful in this area. Drive by only.

Site #19 Continue on County Farm Road and turn E (left) onto CR 1300S (County Line Rd.). At the intersection of Packerton Rd. you will see the Spring Valley Farm. This family operation is a 265 acre family hog farm. It is a farrow to finish operation. They market over 2000 head per year. Drive by only.

Site #20 Continuing along CR 1300S turn N (left) onto CR 400E. At the SE corner of the intersection of CR 1200S and CR 400E you will find the Hayacres Farm. This family farm specializes in veal. 75 acres are tilled and cultivated using only organic fertilizers and biodegradeable soil conditioner. About 570,000 lbs. of Hayacre veal is produced annually. Heritage dates back to the early 1800's. Guided tour by appointment, 982-4881.

Site #21 Continue N another 1/2 mi. to view the Metzger Farm. This dairy farm has registered Guernsey's and a few Holsteins. Over 725 gallons of milk are produced every day. There are 400 acres of corn, 100 acres of soybeans, 100 acres of hay, and 30 acres of wheat. There are about 350 cows. Drive by only.



Site #22 Continue Non CR 400E. Turn W (left) onto CR 1100S. Travel W on CR 1100S at the intersection of CR 200E (Packerton Rd.) you will see the Kline & Kline Farm on the SE corner. This farm deals in hogs, cow-calf herd and feeder, and grain. There are 200 fat cattle and 1000 hogs. 800 acres are farmed also. Drive by only.

Site #23 Turn N (right) onto CR 200E and 1/4 mi. down the Rd. you will see the Ault Stables. This is a harness horse training stable. There are approximately 10 horses in training. Guided tours by appointment, 839-4585.

Site #24 Continue N on CR 200E (Packerton Rd.). At the junction of CR 800S you will see the Metzger Cattle Co., Inc. It is the first place on the N (left) side of CR 800S. This beef cattle farm has a 1.2 million dollar output per year. Drive by only.

Site #25 Continuing Non CR 200E and turning W (left) onto CR 700S and traveling 3 mi. you will see the Don Ault Farm. Dealing in livestock and grain, this family operation buys and sells cattle and a little farming is done on the side. Drive by only.
