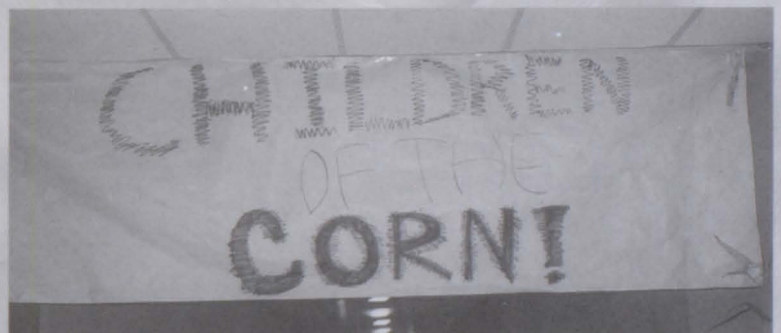

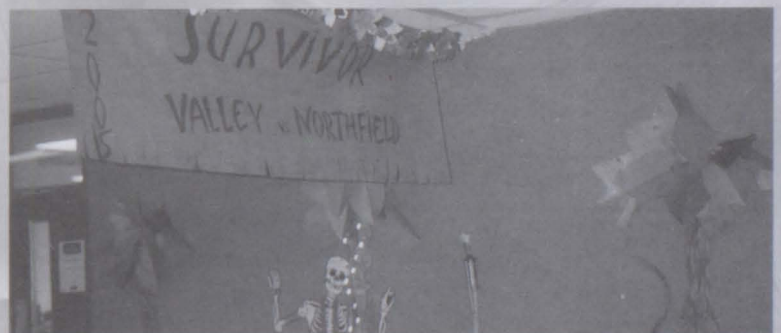

Winter Fest

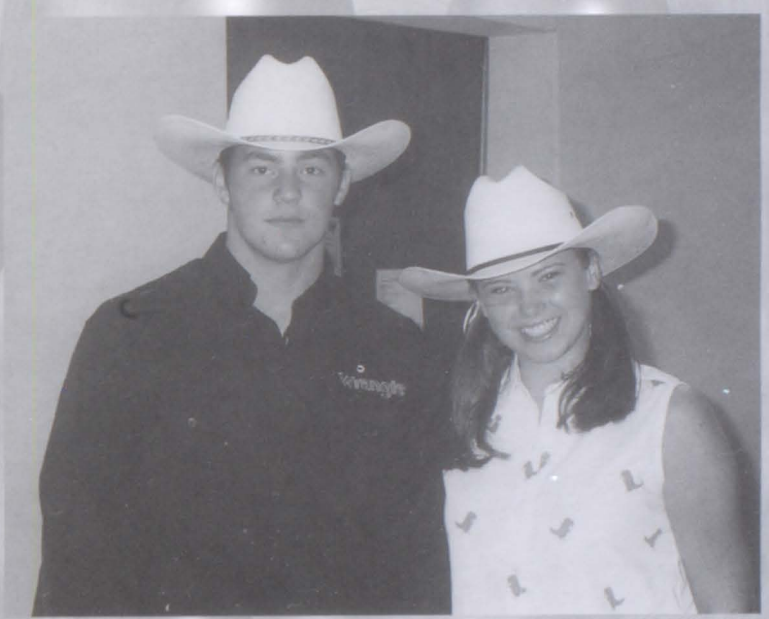

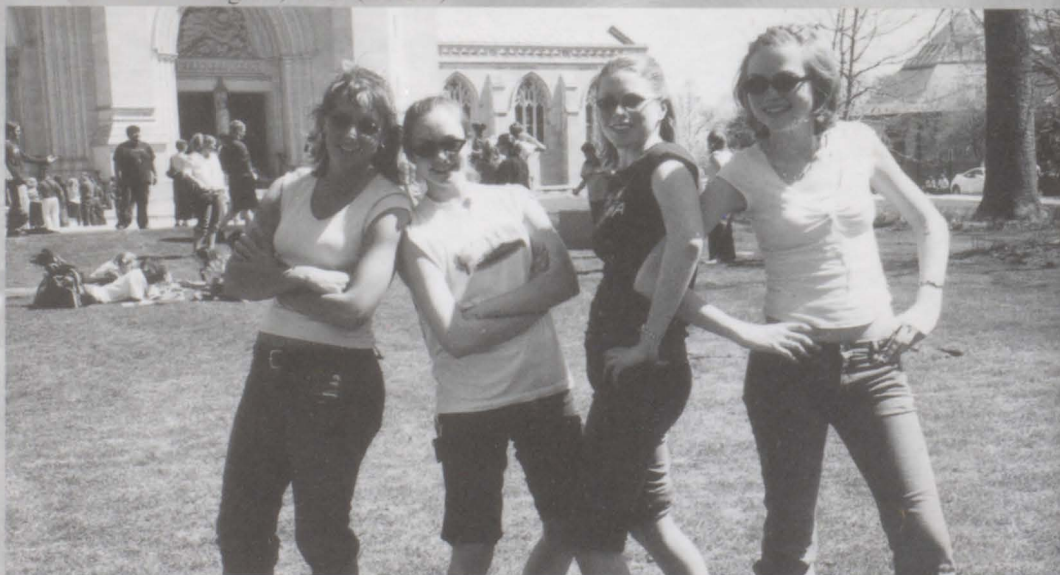

Sound of Music

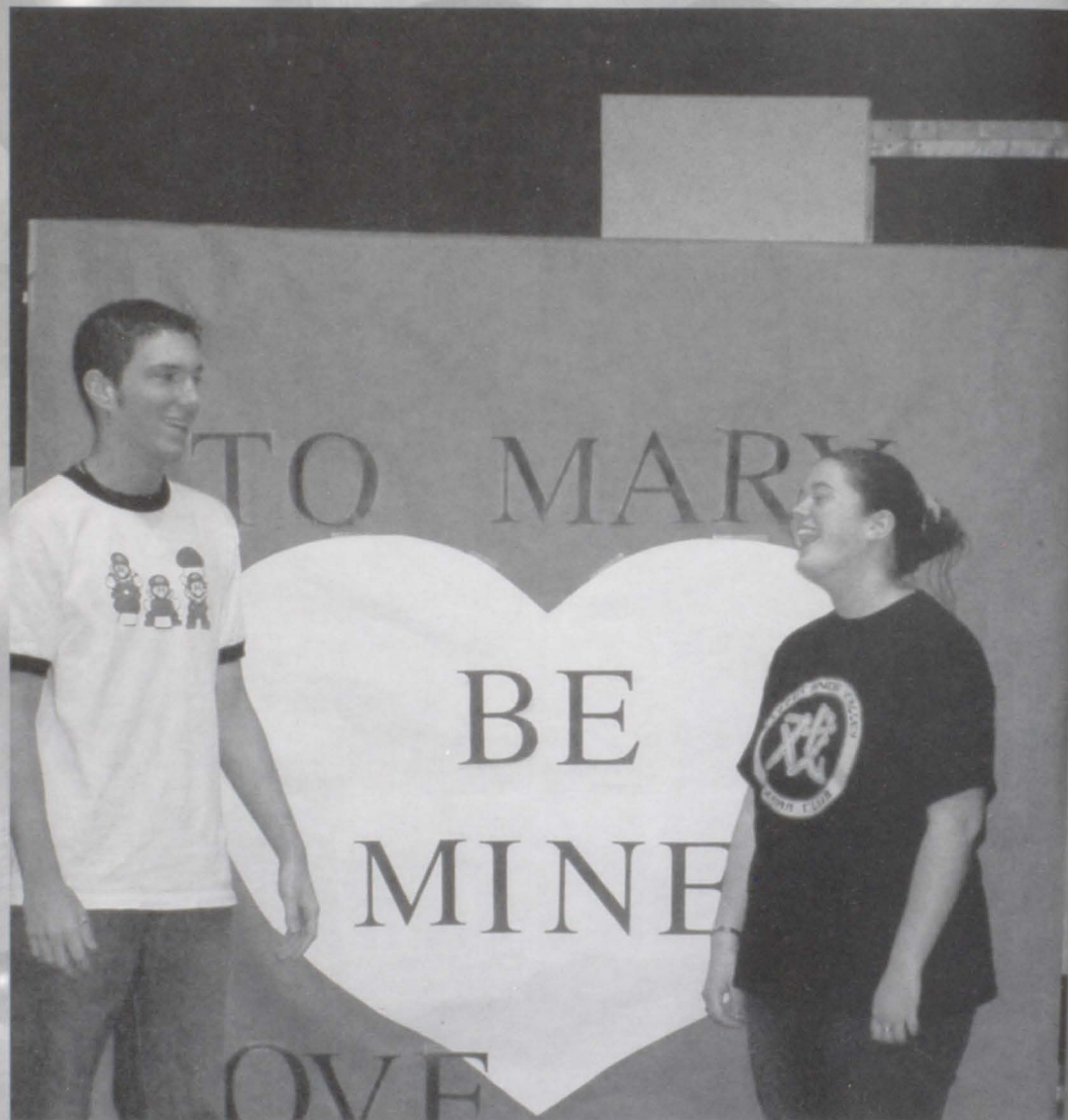

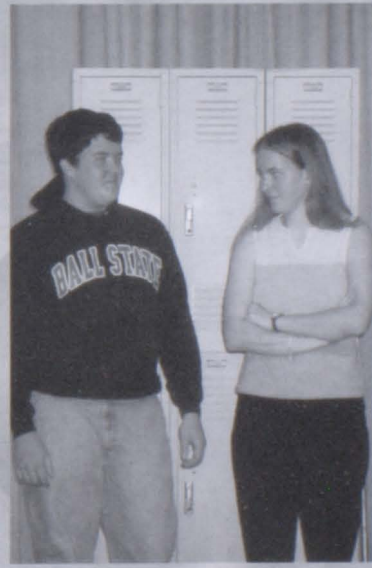
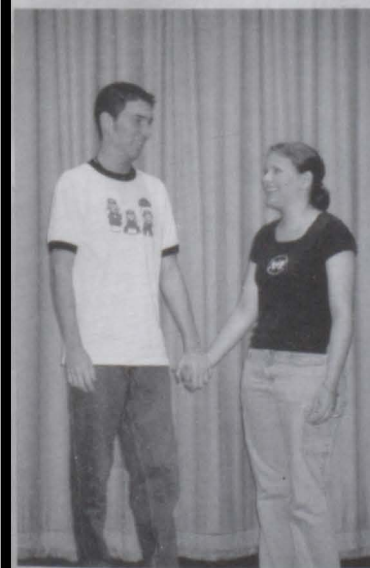
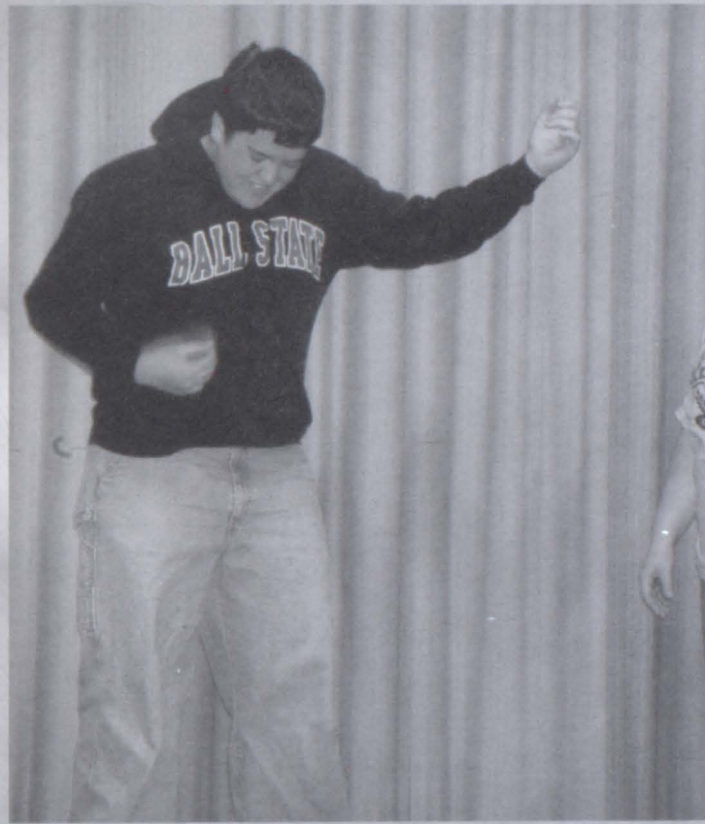




Voices From the High School

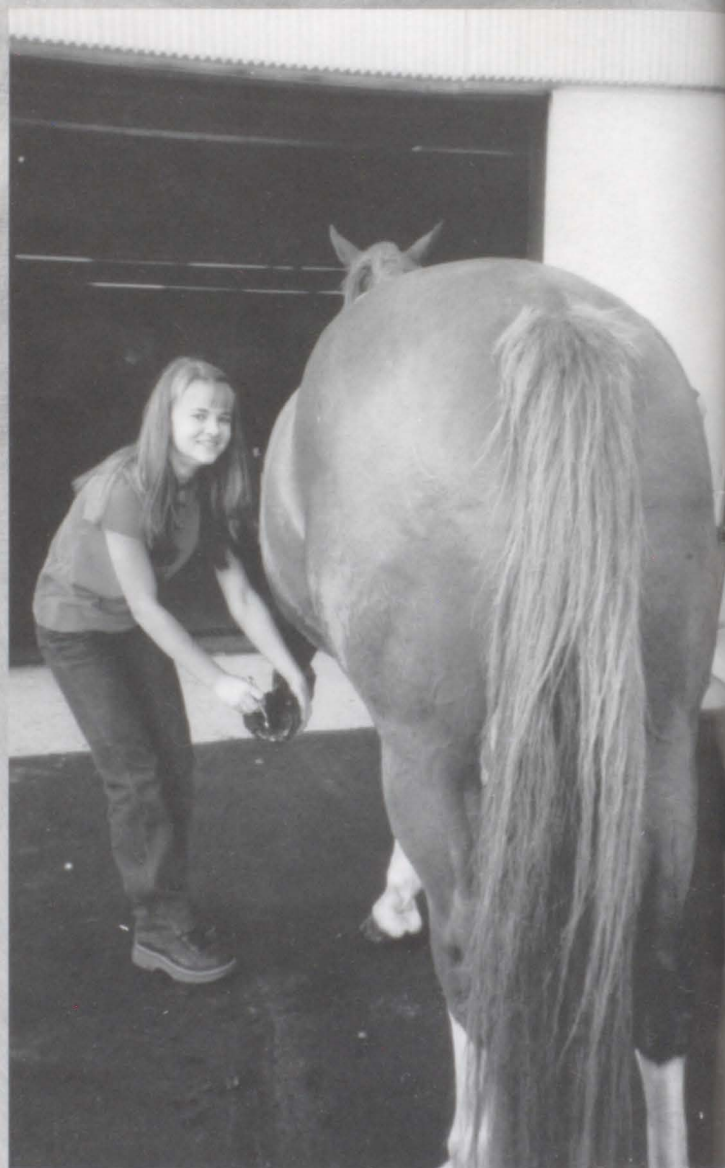

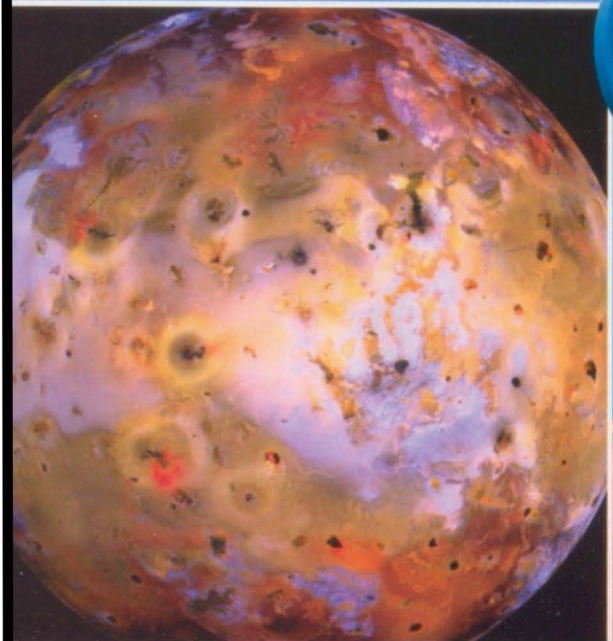

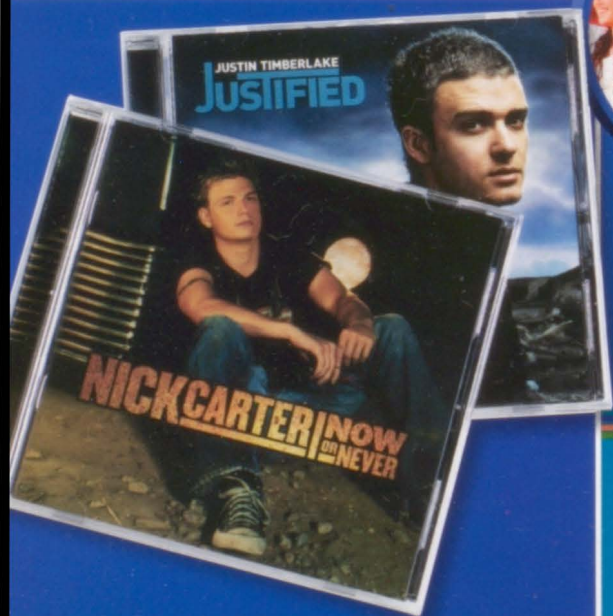
