After deciding that she wanted to become a foreign exchange student, Miriam got the approval through her school, filled out the massive amount of paperwork and got her vaccinations before she was on her way. Coming here she was most worried about not being able to make friends, but after being here she's learned people

are more open to small talk than people in Germany are. "But the people here aren't as great at making good, close friends," Miriam adds.

After asking her about her school system in Germany she explains that it's very different than it is here in America. School in Germany is free, including Universities! After grade school, which is the first four years of your school career in Germany, you go to one of three different schools. Depending on your intellectual level you'll either go to the 'Mittelschule, Realschule or Gymnasium'. Each one prepares you for different aspects of your future. She really enjoyed her schoolyear in the US, and she even had the opportunity to go on some great trips, like to NYC or Washington DC.

Jade Vallarin

Jade became interested in becoming a foreign exchange student when her neighbor explained her experience as one. She then went to a college meeting to get both college information and information about becoming a foreign exchange student. Jade was most scared about the family she was to stay with, but she



likes them and feels comfortable around them. Comparing school here to school back in Belgium, schooling at home is a lot harder. General schooling starts at age 3, and lasts for 14 years.

When she was asked about stereotypes of America, she points out that some Belgians label Americans as "fat" with "fast food everywhere," but they are "very nice, open, and friendly people". Jade didn't have a really hard time to make friends because she met Miriam and a lot of good people who helped her with school.


Than's plans began after he had taken a fairly easy test and filled out an ample amount of paperwork. Coming to America was harder than he had expected because of the language, but since his move here, his English has improved. His difficulties with English also contributed to his fear of being able to talk to people and making new friends. Luckily, Than has been learning English since kindergarten. Before coming here, Than had heard several sterotypes about Americans. He had heard that Americans were smart but had many parties. When comparing Thailand to America, Than notices the many struggles in our country. He states, "Many people don't eat healthy food but eat fast food." We seem lazier and less social. He also realizes that there are many guns around the country, which could have a positive or negative effect on different situations. In Thailand, there are almost no guns available. When comparing the school system in Thailand to America's, there are a handful of differences. For example, in Thailand the class schedule changes daily. Students are required to wear a uniform. From Than's perspective the lessons in Thailand are much more complex than they are here. In his free time, Than likes to hang out with friends and play soccer. After he is done with school, Than plans to go into Stock Brokering. The reason he came to the U.S. is because he wants to attend college at MIT.

Host Families

All of the experience begins with the host families. Miriam, Than and Jade didn't choose their families but the families chose them. It's because of them that they came to Indiana and to this school.

The process of housing a foreign exchange student can be long and strenuous. According to each family though, it is worth it in the end. The first step to becoming a host family is to contact an exchange student organization (ISE -> International Student Exchange) representative. After contacting the representative you must fill out an application that explains everything and information forms about yourself. Along with the paperwork you must send pictures of your household and agree to a required criminal background check to insure the safety of the students.

Many people get introduced to hosting a foreign exchange student in many different ways. It could be from seeing other family members host foreign students or simply being asked to consider it. The most memorable part of housing a foreign exchange student, though, is the experience. For each family it is a remarkable experience that touches both the family and the students. Neither of them regret the decison for one moment!


HOMECOMING




SPORTS


















MCKENZIE MURPHY GIVES A BEHIND THE SCENES LOOK INTO BEING A MANAGER





Since Jacob has been walking, he has been bowling. Jacob's mother started learning from one of her friends. That friend encouraged her to teach Jacob about the sport. Jacob has been bowling by himself all through elementary and middle school, up until he started the High School League.

During the season, between November and January, the team practiced twice a week. "The weird thing about practices," Jacob told us, "Is that everybody has a different way of bowling, so there's no specific way of teaching someone how to do it." To Jacob, bowling isn't like basketball or football where some of the most popular kids get to play because they're charming and are better friends with everyone else. Bowling allows anyone to play. It doesn't matter if you're quiet, or loud, or funny. It all depends on how good you are at playing the game. With bowling, everyone gets to bowl, no matter what.

Jacob is an amazing player. His best score is 246 (out of a 300 point possibility), and that was just goofing around! Bowling has changed Jacob's life, opening him up to new opportunities and chances. He's made best buds with the other kids. He even refers to them as his second family.

Getting a new high score isn't Jacob's only goal. What he's aiming for now is trying to get more people to join the team. "Bowling isn't really a spectator's sport, but when you're playing it, you go all in!"




Senior Trip


















MUSICAL

We asked cast members what went on backstage. "Lots of water!" says Kaden Sebastian, "There were about thirty opened, unfinished water bottles lying around."



POLITICAL AND ECONOMIC STUDIES

Political and Economic Studies is a senior level class that combines Government, Economics, and English 12 into a two period, year round class co-taught by Mr. Shriver and Mrs. Yazel. Combining these classes offers some unique experiences for seniors.



YEA (Young Entrepreneurs Academy)

Through a partnership with the Kosciusko Chamber of Commerce and Grace College, Political and Economic Studies students compete locally for a chance to compete nationally via the Young Entrepreneurs Academy or YEA as well as earn 3 college credits in business. Students, in groups or individually and with the help of Dr. Grossnickle and business mentors from Kosciusko Chamber of Commerce, create business plans to start their own business. Students learn marketing and accounting skills needed to write a business plan. They must also present their business to an investor panel made up of local business men and Grace College professors who will award them start-up funds based on the quality of their plans and presentations. One business is selected to compete at a regional competition in New York.

This year, Michael Thacker's business, Invictus Photography, was chosen to compete in New York. Michael combined his love of sports and photography to create a business. Invictus Photography takes pictures of sorts teams throughout the season then compiles photo CD's to parents with pictures focusing on their child. Michael realized high school sports photography was a niche market not previously explored by other photographers. Selling basketball CD's to parents of both the boys and girls basketball teams lead to requests from parents and students for Michael to photograph other sports seasons.

Tippecanoe Valley's School Board Candidate Forum

While studying the election process, the Political and Economic Studies class decided to host a school board forum where the public could listen to the candidates' views in order to make an informed decision. Students worked in committees to plan and carry out the forum. They contacted the candidates and a moderator (Tim Keefaber of WRSW), created the format and questions, arranged for a venue and set it up and finally advertised the event. The event was held on October 20th with a full house and was well received by the community.





The school board candiadate forum was attended by many. Most seats were filled.



American Studies combines US History and English 11 in one class and offers students the ability to earn 6 Grace College credits in History. By combining these two classes, students gain a better understanding of both US History and American Literature.

For the past three years, the American Studies class has partnered with the Prill School Museum Association to help preserve and maintain the history of a local landmark. Prill School is an 1850's school house located in Fulton County within the Tippecanoe Valley School Corporation.

As in the past three years, the students have planned and carried out a Pioneer Day for fourth grade students at both Mentone and Akron Elementary Schools. The students researched pioneer daily life during the time Prill School was in session and prepare typical activities which allow the fourth graders to experience pioneer life.

Through fundraisers and grants, the American Studies class raised money to buy supplies for the activities. This year, students held a Chili Supper during a home basketball game. Ben Slone and Rafael Jimenez also attended a grant writing session, applied for, and secured a Keys Grant to purchase hand crank ice cream makers for this year's event.

In May, the fourth graders participated in a recreation of local history which included dipping candles, churning butter, making rope and ice cream, playing pioneer games, as well as experiencing traditional school lessons at Prill School. TVHS students as well as the fourth grade students enjoyed learning about local history!

Pioneer Day Pioneer Day is not only a wonderful experience for the 4th graders, but the high schoolers and teachers involved as well. This event is held a week apart at both Akron and Mentone Elementary School. TVHS students are given a chance to teach the 4th graders about events in the 1800s such as, hand cranked ice cream, rope making, funnel cakes, etc. In the afternoon they all travel to Prill School (located outside of the town of Akron) where the 4th graders learn a lesson in Prill School and continue with a variety of events on the lawn of Prill School. Some examples are dream catchers, bobbing for apples, and clothes pin dolls.



These characteristics have been associated with membership in the organization since its beginning in 1921. Today, it is estimated that more than one million students participate in NHS activities. NHS chapters are found in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, many U.S. territories, and Canada. Students are selected for NHS based on GPA eligibility and faculty rating in the pillars of scholarship, leadership, service, and character.

NHS members complete at least 30 hours of community service each year. There are currently 52 NHS members at TVHS. Currently NHS is co-sponsored by school counselor Stephanie Anglin and math teacher/high ability coordinator Kristen Ekhoff. Eligible sophomores are selected every year to join the NHS chapter. Junior/Senior students who qualify are re-evaluated each year by a faculty committee for membership. After students are selected, NHS host an induction ceremony for incoming members and their families in the spring.

Jag is a college and career prep class for Juniors and Seniors who not only want to go to college or a university after high school but be in full time employment. Jag does different fun activities and projects, such as community service and college visits.
