

What is your job as a football manager? My job is to get the players water and keep them filled. Also equipment and helping out with whatever is needed.


Do you plan to be a football manager next year again? Yes, I do. I really like it. The players are cool I like the people. It's really fun. Above: The bell after being won back.



















Jarod Duzenbury-'96 Ford F-350. Its a desiel 5 speed. "I like to smoke them out!"















Second Day; the group visted many scared monuments like the World War 2 Memorial, Lincoln Memorial and the Washington Monument.


