




















Movie Matinee!

Staff's Favorite Recipes

Lemon & White Chocolate Spring Fantasy Fudge

The most fun, whimsical, delicious fudge to celebrate any special occasion. This one seems to shout spring!

Ingredients

- 3 cups sugar
- 3/4 cup butter
- 2/3 cup half and half
- 12 oz. white chocolate chips
- 1 (7 oz.) jar marshmallow crème
- Zest of 1 large lemon, finely grated
- 1-2 drops food coloring per bowl, two drops for each bowl. One bowl, a drop of each of blue and green to create turquoise and in the other bowl, a drop of yellow and a drop of green to create a spring green color.
- Jimmies, sprinkles, nonpareils, etc., your choice of colors. Spring colors were used but you could adapt this to any season.

Directions

- 1. Line 9-inch square pan with foil, with ends of foil extending over 2 of the sides. Spray foil and sides of pan with cooking spray and rub to cover evenly with a paper towel. Set aside. Also spray a small thin-bladed knife with cooking spray (a butter knife works well for this). Set aside.
- 2. Combine sugar, butter, and half and half in a sauce pan (at least 3 qt. size) over medium heat until mixture comes to a full rolling boil, stirring constantly (don't mistake bubbling at the edges for a full boil). Once it comes to a full boil, cook exactly 4 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove from heat. Add white chocolate chips, marshmallow crème and lemon zest. Stir again until smooth and well mixed (this will take several minutes, sometimes it seems like all the lumps of marshmallow crème and the little chips will never be melted but don't give up.)
- 3. Remove a scant 1/4 of the mixture to a small microwave-safe bowl. Repeat another scant 1/4 to another microwave safe bowl. Add one or two drops of food color to each small bowl, the turquoise in one and spring green in the other. Leave the larger amount in the sauce pan white. Work very quickly to stir the small bowls until color is well mixed. Adjust color as needed.
- 4. Pour about half of mixture into prepared pan. Tilt pan to cover the bottom. Add about half of each of the colored mixture in random spoonful's over the surface. Add the rest of the white fudge batter. Don't worry if it doesn't completely cover the colored areas. Add the rest of the colored batter in random spoonful's. Try to leave areas of white showing. If any of the batters start to thicken you can pop them in the microwave for 10-15 seconds.
- 5. Using the thin edge of a knife, run it back and forth a few times through fudge creating a swirled pattern. Don't swirl too much or the whole mixture will run together.
- 6. Quickly sprinkle the top with jimmies and sprinkles. Cool completely and then cut into squares. It cuts better if cooled to room temperature instead of refrigerating it. Use foil to lift fudge from pan before cutting.

Mason Jar Easter Craft!

Make these cute mason jars filled with Easter treats for family and friends. Here is what you will need.


- pint sized jars with lids
- 12 small chocolate bunnies
- A couple of packages of edible Easter grass or regular grass will work, too.
- Small candies of your choice, M&Ms, jelly beans, etc.
- 4x4 inch Fabric squares for the lids, or raffia for tying around the lid (optional)

Put the grass at the bottom of each jar. Unwrap the bunnies and stand them up in the center of the jar. Start pouring in your candy, not a lot but just enough to cover part of the bunny. Give the jar a little shake (hold on to the bunny) to get the candy settled. Next, set your jar lid, without the ring on top of the bunny, then set a fabric square on top of that. Line up the jar ring over the fabric, press the lid down carefully if the bunny is sticking up slightly, and tighten the ring on the jar. So easy you can make them with your kids for Easter gifts.

Abandoned Places

Bond movie Skyfall's deserted island is a real place. The island is known as Hashima and is located about 9 miles off the Japanese coast in the East China Sea. In the late 1881s, coal was found on the sea floor beneath the island. Japan's Mitsubishi company mined the coal and would ferry miners to and from the work site form Nagasaki. Then, the company decided it would be easier to build houses for the workers and families on



Hashima itself. Giant concrete apartment blocks were built along with schools, bath houses, temples, restaurants, markets, even a graveyard were built, all on the space the size of a football field. At one point the population reached 5,000 people. Hashima is now completely abandoned. In 1974 the coal ran out and the Mitsubishi Company told the people that they would have work for them on the mainland, provided on a first come first served basis. This caused the people living there to leave so quickly, they left coffee cups on tables and bicycles leaning against walls. The movie Skyfall only features external shots of Hashima. The scenes on the island were actually shot in a studio. That's because Japanese officials don't allow anyone to set foot on the island itself. Meanwhile Doutoku Sakamoto, a former inhabitant of the island wants the island to be recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. But South Korea objects because the Japanese allegedly used Koreans as slave laborers on Hashima. It's yet another shameful chapter in the islands history. The place, some say is haunted. There is something not right about the place for sure. There is nothing pretty about it. The whole place is like death and decay.
