Staff's Favorite Recipes

Wild Violet Syrap

Violet syrup has a nice sweet floral taste and makes a nice addition to your tea.

Now you know what to do with those pesky weeds.

#### For this recipe you will need:

- Wild violet blossoms
- Water
- Sugar
- Lemon Juice
- ⇒ You will use white sugar in this recipe to achieve the ideal color. Amounts will depend on the amount of wild blossoms you harvest.
- ⇒ Making violet syrup is simple. The most time consuming part of the process is picking the flower heads. How many violet blossoms you use, is up to you. The recipe is a 1:1 ratio so you can use as many or as little as you wish.
- ⇒ Once you have picked your violets, place them in a jar or glass and add enough boiling water to cover the flowers
- ⇒ Let the flowers steep for an hour or two (until the water cools). Your violet water will look blue or green at this point, the violet color comes later when the lemon is added.
- ⇒ At this point strain the flowers from the infused water and discard. Be sure it's clear of any debris. Add equal parts violet infused water and sugar to a saucepan.
- ⇒ Slowly add small amount of lemon juice until desired color is reached. Be careful not to add too much lemon juice or it will overpower the floral taste of your violet water.
- ⇒ Now slowly bring the sugar water to a low boil for a minute or two. Keep an eye on it and stir occasionally. That's it! You have

violet syrup now. Who would have thought.

⇒ Transfer your syrup to whatever container you wish. Just make sure it's a clear glass container because you are going to want to show this stuff off.





Home made
















## Abandoned Places

Pidhirstsi Castle, Pidhistsi, Ukraine. This castle was built between 1635 and 1640 for Hetman, the Cossack Chief of the Polish crown. The castle remained in the hands of the Polish military leaders into the eighteenth century. The proprietors of the complex amassed a major collection of paintings, sculpture, armor, and crafts in a private collection. It is now managed by the Museum of Fine Arts in L'viv, which has overseen the site since 1991. The



site is designated as part of the national cultural heritage of the Ukraine. The complex underwent a number of renovations in the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries but suffered damage during the twentieth century. During the Polish-Soviet War (1919-1921) the castle was seriously vandalized and after World II it was converted into a sanatorium for tuberculosis patients. In 1956 a fire started by a lightning storm caused major damage and during the Soviet regime the castle was at various times either abandoned or misused. All of these factors have resulted in the deterioration of the east and west wings of the palace. The Museum of Fine Arts in L'viv is willing to return the Hetman's collection to Pidhirtsi if the means and technical expertise necessary to restore the castle can be found.
