RECIPES:

Whole Corn On The Grill

4 ears of corn, in husk Charred Spring Onion & Sesame-Chile Butter

PREPARATION

Prepare grill for medium heat. Grill corn, rotating occasionally, until husks are blackened (some will flake and fall off) and kernels are tender with some browned and

charred spots, 25–35 minutes. Let corn cool slightly, then shuck. Serve with Charred Spring Onion and Sesame-Chile Butter.

Rosemary Ranch Chicken Kabobs

1/2 cup olive oil
1/2 cup ranch dressing
3 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
1 tablespoon minced
fresh rosemary
2 teaspoons salt
1 teaspoon lemon juice
1 teaspoon white vinegar
1/4 teaspoon ground

1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper, or to taste 1 tablespoon white sugar, or to taste (optional) 5 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves cut into 1 inch cubes

PREPARATION

- 1. In a medium bowl, stir together the olive oil, ranch dressing, Worcestershire sauce, rosemary, salt, lemon juice, white vinegar, pepper, and sugar. Let stand for 5 minutes. Place chicken in the bowl, and stir to coat with the marinade. Cover and refrigerate for 30 minutes.
- 2. Preheat the grill for medium-high heat. Thread chicken onto skewers and discard marinade.
- 3. Lightly oil the grill grate.

 Grill skewers for 8 to 12 minutes, or until the chicken is no longer pink in the center, and the juices run clear.




Article on E-Books
