# Staff's Favorite Recipes

## Baked Bean Casserole!

*This recipe is from  
Trisha Yearwood.  
A great dish  
to make for  
your next cookout.*



### Ingredients

- 1 1/2 lb. ground beef
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 bell pepper, cleaned and chopped
- 2 15-16 oz. cans pork and beans
- 1/2 cup barbecue sauce
- 1/2 cup ketchup
- 2 Tbsp. spicy brown mustard
- 2 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 1 Tbsp. soy sauce
- 4 Tbsp. brown sugar
- 6-8 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled

### Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees and spray 9 x13 pan with nonstick cooking spray.
2. Brown ground beef, onion, and bell pepper.
3. Add pork and beans and everything except bacon. Stir well and cook for 5 minutes.
4. Pour into prepared casserole dish.
5. Top with bacon and cover dish with tin foil.
6. Bake for 45 minutes. Remove foil and bake for another 10 minutes.
7. Let casserole stand for 10 minutes before serving.

1/2 T cumin  
1/2 T pepper  
1/2 T dried basil  
1/2 T dried parsley

jar and shake until  
all spices are well

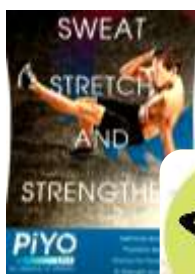

## Abandoned Places!

The Loew's Palace Theatre opened as the Poli's Palace Theatre on September 4, 1922 in Bridgeport Connecticut. It was designed by architect Thomas W. Lamb. The 3,642 seat theatre was the biggest movie theatre in Connecticut and remains the largest of Bridgeport's theaters. It's sister theatre, the Majestic, located next to the Palace in the same building was opened two months later. After years of vaudeville and silent film the palace began showing major motion pictures. Thirty years later it was renamed the Loew's Palace Theatre. Due to a decline in ticket sales the Loew's corporation sold the building in the early 1970's. After showing adult films for a few years the Palace closed permanently in 1975. Joy Center Ministries, Inc., who had the rights to sell or lease portions of the building, intended to rent out the store fronts and turn the theater into a Christian revival center. But the project was put on hold when it was discovered that the city of Bridgeport had a \$1.2 million lien on the property due to unpaid taxes. The city took possession of the building in lieu of payment. Since its closing, the interior of the Palace has been used as a set in movies. It is now listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The city of Bridgeport hopes to one day restore the theater to its former glory.
