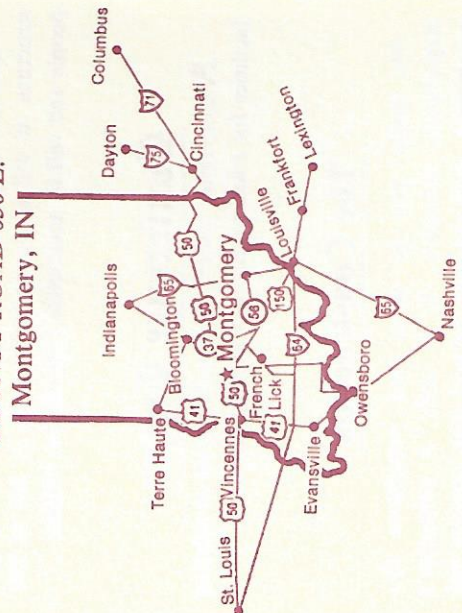


Company Background and Philosophy

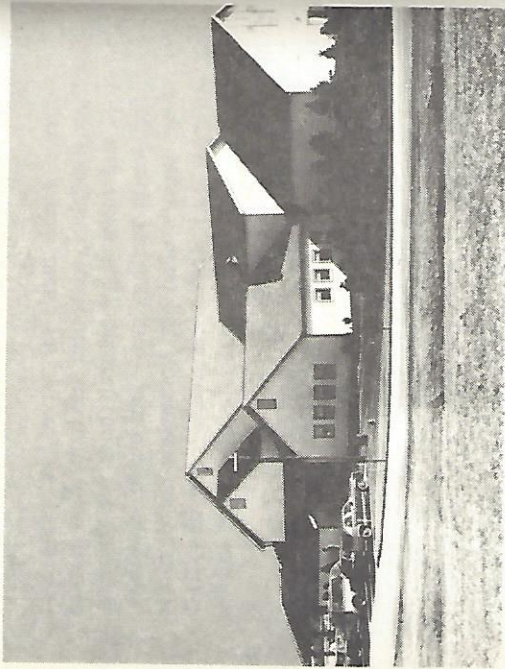

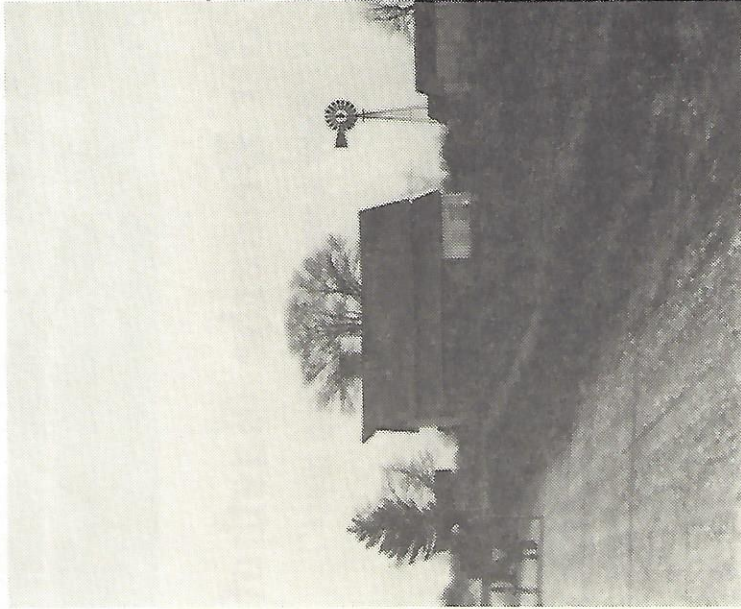

Restaurant

The first phase to open was the restaurant, seating 600 guests. It includes dining, banquet and short order facilities. The rural Amish motif of the facility is exemplified in the charming two story "bank barn" design.

Authentic Amish meals are served, including such favorites as chicken, roast beef and ham. Real mashed potatoes and other tasty natural foods are featured, including Amish stuffing, gravy and mixed vegetables. The meals include salad bar, homemade bread, choice of beverage and dessert. A bakery provides fresh homemade baked goods for restaurant patrons and the surrounding communities.

Gift Shop

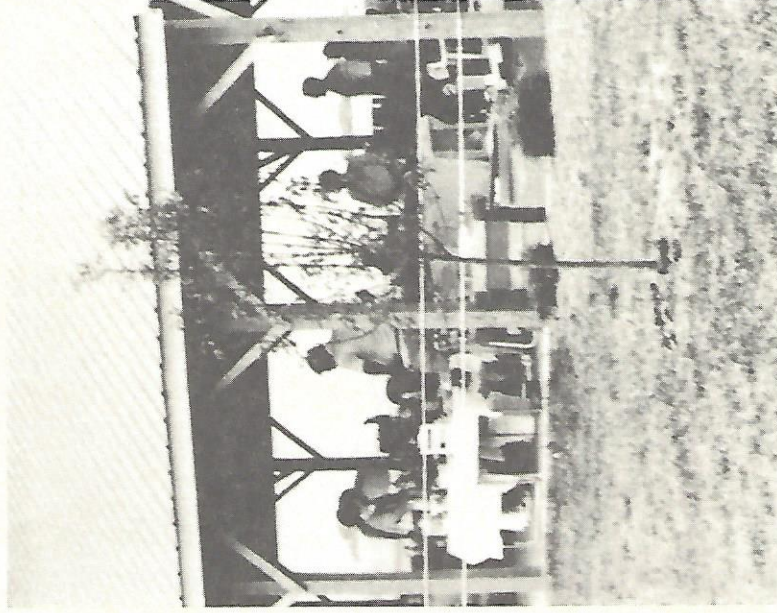
During the first phase the gift shop will be located in the restaurant. Quaint craft and gift items are featured, many handmade by the local craftsmen: Amish quilts, lovely country-style wood carvings, rag rugs, wall hangings, hand-stitched dolls and hundreds more.

Farmer's Market

Enclosed for year-round comfort, this will serve as an outlet where local residents and farmers can sell their produce and other goods.

Flea Market

The flea market will include approximately 800 to 1,000 seasonal outdoor booths and 80 to 100 permanent indoor booths. The outdoor flea market will be held weekly during the summer months. The indoor flea market will be used year-round for goods that require protection from the weather.

Motel

This will be a specialty "boutique Inn" and is expected to have approximately 35 rooms. Styled after a typical Amish "grosdaudy" house, it will be a large two story farm house, and will appear to have had several additions made to it over the years.

Village

Shops will be clustered to provide the convenience and atmosphere of a "village" while maintaining the appearance of farm outbuildings. Provisions will be made for businesses requiring as little as 100 square feet or as much as several thousand. Some of the small businesses will include Country Store, Leather Goods, Apple Cider & Butter, Quilts, Woodworking, Crafts, Cheese, Candy, Ice Cream, Gifts, Books, etc.

Auction Building

The auction building will be a large pole barn type structure. It will accommodate crowds of 500 to 750 people and will be associated with the flea market.

Conference Center

A conference center will provide retreat or meeting facilities for small to medium-sized companies.

The Construction
