## Corydon 1883 Scenic Railroad

**Walnut & Water Sts., Corydon 47112, (812) 738-8000**

Enjoy the one and one half hour rail adventure through the rolling hills of Southern Indiana. The adventure begins at the LMAC Railroad Station in Corydon. Scheduled trains depart May through October on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays at 10:30 a.m., 1:00 p.m., and 3:00 p.m. Also Fridays at 1:00 p.m. Also enjoy the gift shop located in the depot.

## Corydon Capitol State Historic Site

The "Old Capitol" site is actually two historic buildings — Indiana's first state Capitol (c. 1816), and the Governor's Headquarters (c. 1817). The Capitol building is made of native walnut and poplar with blue limestone floors and walls. Built in the Federal style, the governor's Headquarters was the 7-room house of Governor William Hendricks from 1822-1825. Today it features rooms decorated in the styles of the 1820's, 1850's and 1880's, plus a restored cooking hearth and kitchen. Also popular is the "Constitution Elm" monument where part of the constitution was written. The Visitor's Center features wooden toys, gifts and historical books. Free tours daily. Closed Monday.

## Culbertson Mansion State Historic Site

Overlooking the winding Ohio River in New Albany, the towering Culbertson Mansion stands as an impressive tribute to one of Indiana's leading merchants and philanthropists, William S. Culbertson. A spectacular hand-painted ceiling accenting the formal parlor rises majestically over marble fireplaces, and a three-story mahogany and rosewood staircase reflects the Mansion's Victorian ambience. Completed in 1869, the home illustrates the affluent lifestyle of Ohio River towns during the post-Civil War period. Closed Monday.

## Derby Dinner Playhouse

Derby Dinner Playhouse is a dinner theatre in the round featuring top-notch performances of Broadway productions, an excellent buffet dinner and your favorite cocktails. The theatre uses only the finest actors, assuring the audience of the very best in professional entertainment. Seating for 574 guests is arranged on four tiers around an elevator stage creating an excellent view for all. A different Broadway musical, comedy or mystery is presented every six to eight weeks. Closed Monday.

## Falls of the Ohio State Park (Fossil Beds)

The Falls of the Ohio, world renowned for its 350-400 million year old fossilized coral reef, rich history, and extensive bird, fish and wildlife, is Southern Indiana's unique and special gem. Recently declared an Indiana State Park, this area is the focus of an energetic campaign to build an educational and recreational center, which is scheduled to open in the Spring of 1992. The Center will house exhibits created by internationally acclaimed exhibit and video artists, and is being designed by award winning architects, ensuring that the Center will be the finest in the country. The Falls of the Ohio State Park is open year round, however "fossil season" is June through August (the time in which the beds are most exposed). Visitors are welcome at any time to discover the many treasures of the Falls of the Ohio. Tours may be available. Please call for reservations.

## Hillierich & Bradsby Slugger Park

Home of the famous "Louisville Slugger" hardwood baseball bats and Powerbilt golf clubs. See the personal bats of such baseball legends as Babe Ruth and Hank Aaron in the museum. Also on display is a World Series Team Bat collection dating back to 1935, bats used to set major records, golf club memorabilia, baseball personalities photo gallery and current World Series champions' uniforms. Free guided tours of the baseball bat and golf club manufacturing process are given Mon. - Fri. at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. Call for exact schedule. Slugger Park is closed the last week of June, the first two weeks in July, all national holidays and a week at Christmas.

## Howard Steamboat Museum

Around 1890, when the great steamboat era was flourishing, Edmunds J. Howard began construction of the 22-room mansion which today houses the Howard Steamboat Museum. The house itself is a magnificent Victorian structure, standing as a lasting tribute to the greatest steamboat building family in history. The museum, one-of-its-kind in the U.S., is famous for its original furnishings, c. 1893, 15 varieties of elegant hand carved wood paneling, fancy brass chandeliers, a grand stairway, lovely antiques. Also a collection of famous boat models (Robt. E. Lee, Natchez, City of Louisville), pilot wheels, hull models, flatboat model, the "doctor", shipyard tools, pictures and much more are on display. Closed Monday.

## Huber Orchard, Winery & U-Pick Farm

Not too far north of the Ohio River, just beyond a cluster of hills called the "Knobs," Southern Indiana settles into a quiet, gentle farmland; a picturesque, rolling countryside known as Stadler, Indiana. Here in this rural area is where you'll find Huber Orchard, Winery and U-Pick Farm. And there's fun to be had at the Huber's, depending on the season, everything from picking strawberries and apples to chopping your own Christmas tree, to browsing in the Gift Shoppes. Wine tasting, sandwiches and wine cellar tours available in the Winery. Newest venture, The Cheese Factory, offers cheeses, sausages, ice cream, etc. Come watch cheese being made. Tours available, groups welcome. Horseback riding on premises.

## Squire Boone Caverns & Village

**Corydon exit 105 off I-64, Hwy. 135 south, (502) 426-4390**

Squire Boone and his older brother Daniel, were on one of their hunting expeditions when they discovered these beautiful caverns in 1790. Today, you can tour these caverns on safe concrete and steel walkways past shimmering underground waterfalls and breathtaking views of nature's handiwork deep below the earth's surface! Squire's Grist Mill grinds out over 20 different meals and mixes that you can sample in our bakery. Or take a stroll through the log cabin village that houses colorful and friendly craftspeople busy making soap, candles, wood and leather products and homemade breads, soups and salads made from scratch . . . all fresh and delicious. Cavern tours, hayrides, craft demonstrations, Boone's Mill, Indian relic museum, farm animal petting zoo and the Squire Boone Nature Trail are all waiting for you at Squire Boone Caverns & Village. Cave open weekends January and February. Open daily March through December. Village open daily Memorial Day - August 20th.

## Wave-Tek Water Park

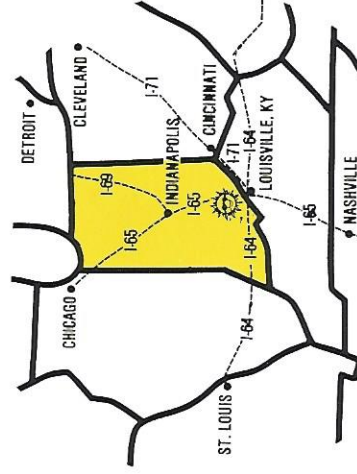

Zimmerman Art Glass Factory has developed an art form which traces its origin back to pre-revolutionary America. Visitors are welcome to watch artists shape the paperweights, bowls, lamps, bottles and other objects of art by hand. Each piece is truly "handmade." Starting as a small nucleus of molten crystal, each creation is built up layer by layer with clear and colored glass - the colored glass particles being manipulated into position to form the designs. Admission is free. Open Tues. - Sat.
