

## Introduction

The 1990 *Directory of Indiana Children's Authors and Illustrators* updates and expands the first *Directory* published by the Stone Hills Library Network in 1986. In the intervening four years, many Indiana children's authors and illustrators have published for the first time, many included in the first edition have published new books or moved to new addresses, and a few have died.

The *Directory* includes living children's authors and illustrators who are lifelong Hoosiers, as well as those who were born in Indiana but now live elsewhere, those who lived in Indiana at some time in the past, and those born outside the state but now living here.

In this completely updated edition, we have added illustrators. We have thoroughly researched each author and illustrator included to provide current address and publication information. We have not included those who were recommended but did not answer our inquiries and for whom we could find no evidence of having published. We have moved those for whom our information was inadequate to the Appendix, hoping that by including them at least referentially, we might gain enough information to be able to contact them in the future. The Appendix also includes the authors whom we know are deceased since the 1986 edition.

We have included brief biographical information, either from the authors and illustrators themselves or from published biographical sources. We believe the biographies are the most important addition, since they yield very personal and three-dimensional portraits.

Stone Hills Library Network, a cooperative of 54 libraries in southwest central Indiana, has been involved since its formation with coordination and planning of programs for its member libraries. Since many of the school and public libraries serve small rural communities, they have often asked for support from the Network in locating quality presenters, arranging for their visits, coordinating scheduling and providing publicity materials.

We hope that this *Directory* will serve, as the first edition has, as a starting point for librarians, school media specialists, teachers and others who want to contact an Indiana author or illustrator. The geographical index will help those looking for someone from a particular part of the state. The author and illustrator index will assist readers who are looking for one or the other. The text includes references to the Appendix and from pseudonyms to names.

Incidentally, Oberreich's theatrical career had begun at age 8 as Toto in the Wizard of Oz at the Booth-Tarkington Civic Theatre, within a few blocks of his birthplace in Indianapolis. Sixty-one years and 35 "Show Biz" scrap-books later, Bob "retired" to his beloved northern Hoosier lake country to share his creative expertise with the more than 300 boys and girls who have participated in his YMCA Elkhart Youth Theatre and circuses since 1979, entertainingly educating aspiring young authors, thespians and artists with scenes from the literary classics."
