Dear friend Arden:

With regard to your telephone call, I have looked through some of the Mentone Egg Show information that I have in my file and I find the first Mentone Egg Show was held in 1930. A notation that I have taken from the second annual Egg Show catalog states that 400 sat down to a banquet at the 1937 Mentone Egg Show, and this was the largest banquet ever held in Mentone.

I find such names as Roy Rush, Ken Dolan, C.O. Eiler, Oliver Teel, Royce Tucker, Forest Kessler, Mace Nelson, Chester Manwaring, Hobart Creighton, and Cecil Long on the various committees connected with the second Mentone Egg Show. As far as I know the same group were instrumental in getting together and starting the first Mentone Egg Show in 1936. At least, some if not all of these members were instrumental in starting the first Mentone Egg Show.

The seventh annual Mentone Egg Show came in 1946 after having dropped the show for a few years during the war.

In 1946 the surrounding communities putting on the Mentone Egg Show used on all advertising a map of Indiana centered in the middle of the picture a large basket of eggs and each egg named for a surrounding community, and this all called, "Egg Basket of the Middlewest". The communities surrounding this territory which participate are Rochester, Argos, Milford, Hamlet, Etha Green, New Paris, Leesburg, Pierceton, Claypool, North Manchester, Denver, Chili, Akron, Plymouth, Bourbon, Atwood, Warsaw, Burket, Silver Lake, and Mentone.
