## Mentone to celebrate 100 years — 1882-1982

Mentone's residents have been putting the finishing touches on buildings and streets throughout the town polishing up for its Centennial celebrations beginning June 6. Even the giant egg, that boasts "Mentone — Egg Basket of the Midwest," got a fresh coat of paint from the art students at Tippecanoe Valley High School for the 100-year birthday party.

Festivities begin Sunday, June 6, at 12 noon with the Centennial Grand Opening Ceremony. A chicken barbecue will immediately follow in Mentzer Park until 7 p.m. In addition to the barbecue, several important events will take place on Sunday including an autograph party at the Bell Library from 1-4 p.m. and at 2 p.m. the grand opening and dedication of the Lawrence D. Bell Aviation Museum.

### Bell Museum

Lawrence Bell, aviation pioneer, who designed the X-1 jet which broke the first sound barrier, is a native of Mentone and founded the Bell Aircraft Corporation in Buffalo, N. Y., prior to World War II. He then established the Bell Helicopter Company in Texas. Memorabilia of Bell will be displayed in the museum.

At 4 p.m. on Sunday there will be a Centennial Spelling Bee at the junior high school, followed by a community gospel sing. Don't leave yet, because there'll be a fireworks display at the school grounds.
