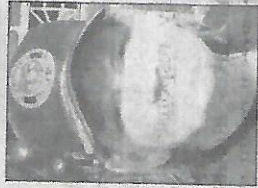

Harlan was born on Sept. 30, 1956, in Prestonsburg, Ky., to the late Charles D. and Velma Newsome Amburgy.

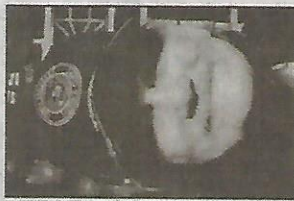
He was a factory supervisor and worked for Kralis Brothers, Othy and Zimmer Orthopedics.

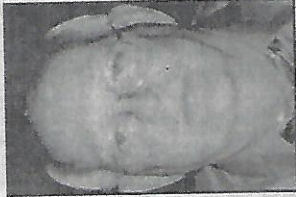
