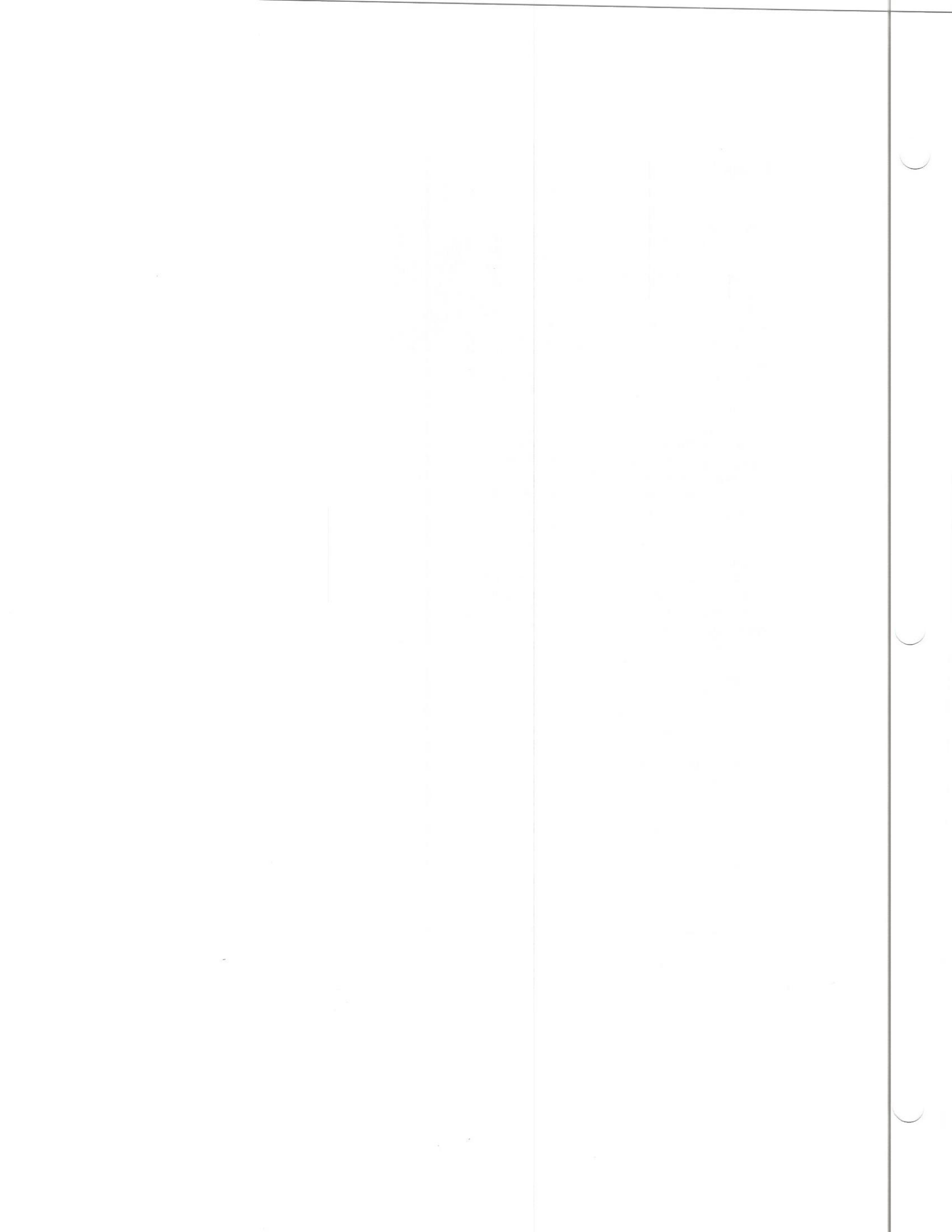

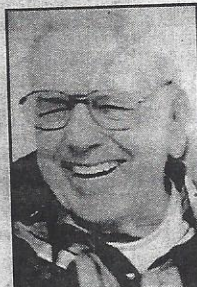

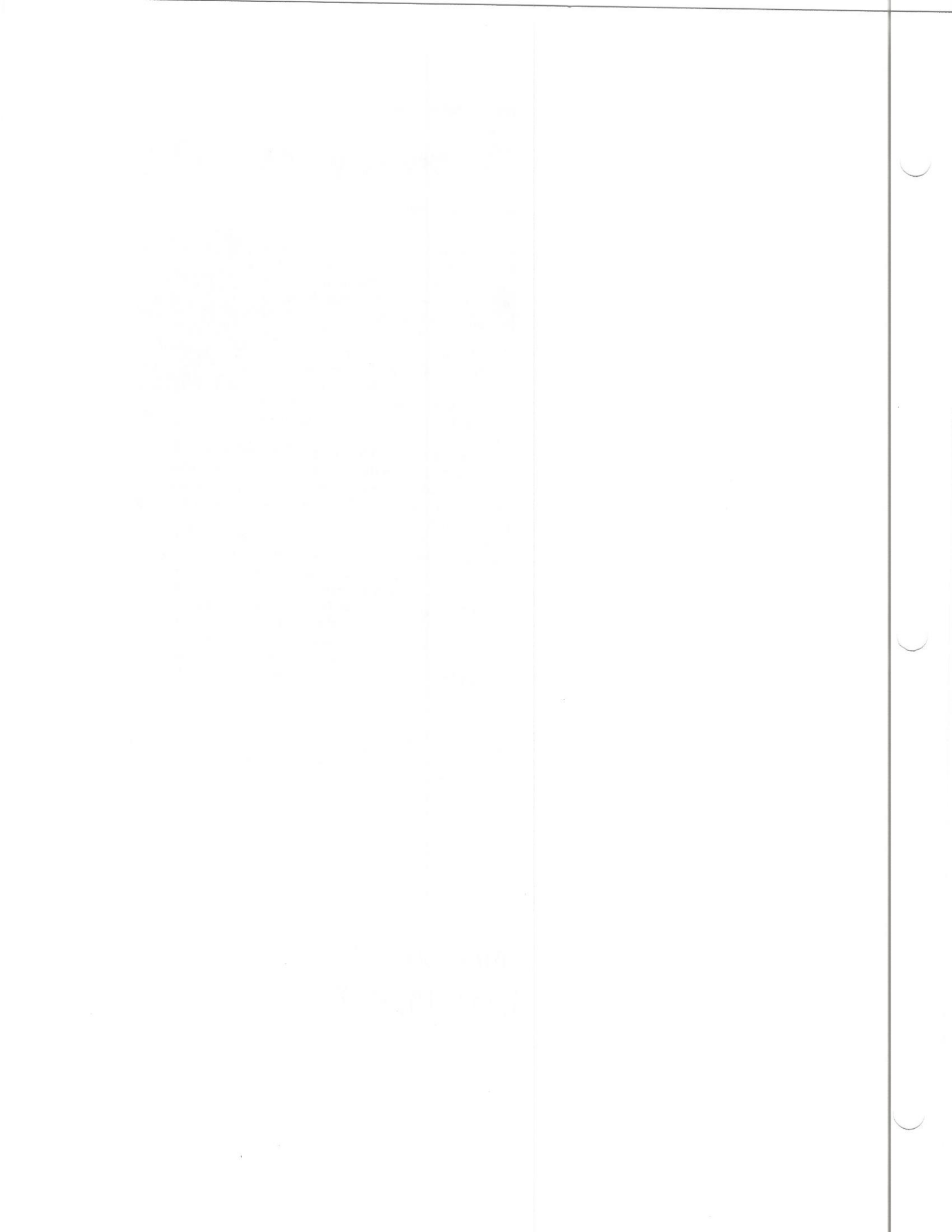

She worked as a QMA at Miller's Merry Manor, Warsaw, for 43 years, retiring in 2010. She attended the Church of Christ, Warsaw.

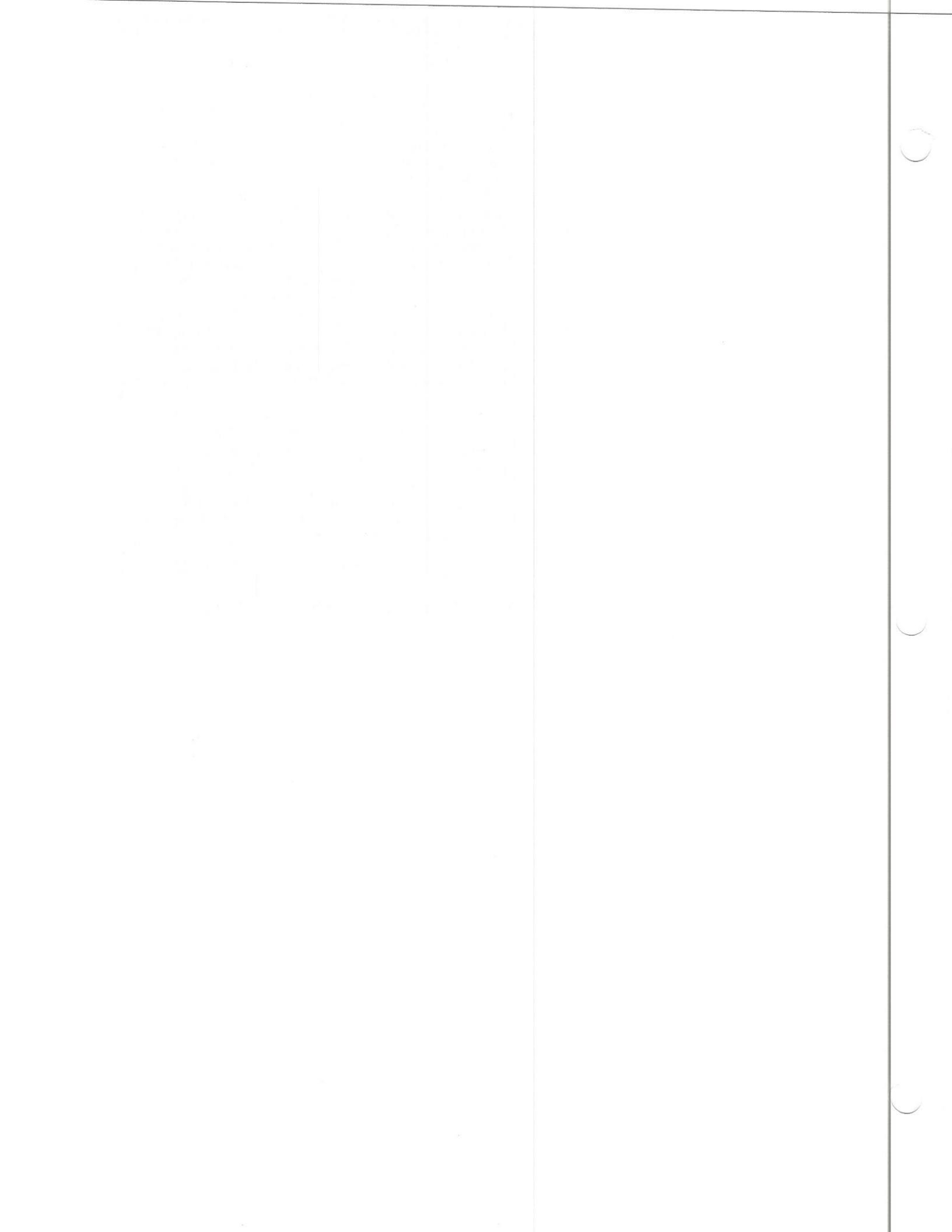

Judy was preceded in death by her parents; stepmother Roselyn Syler; and sisters Marge Thacker and Sheryl Simons.

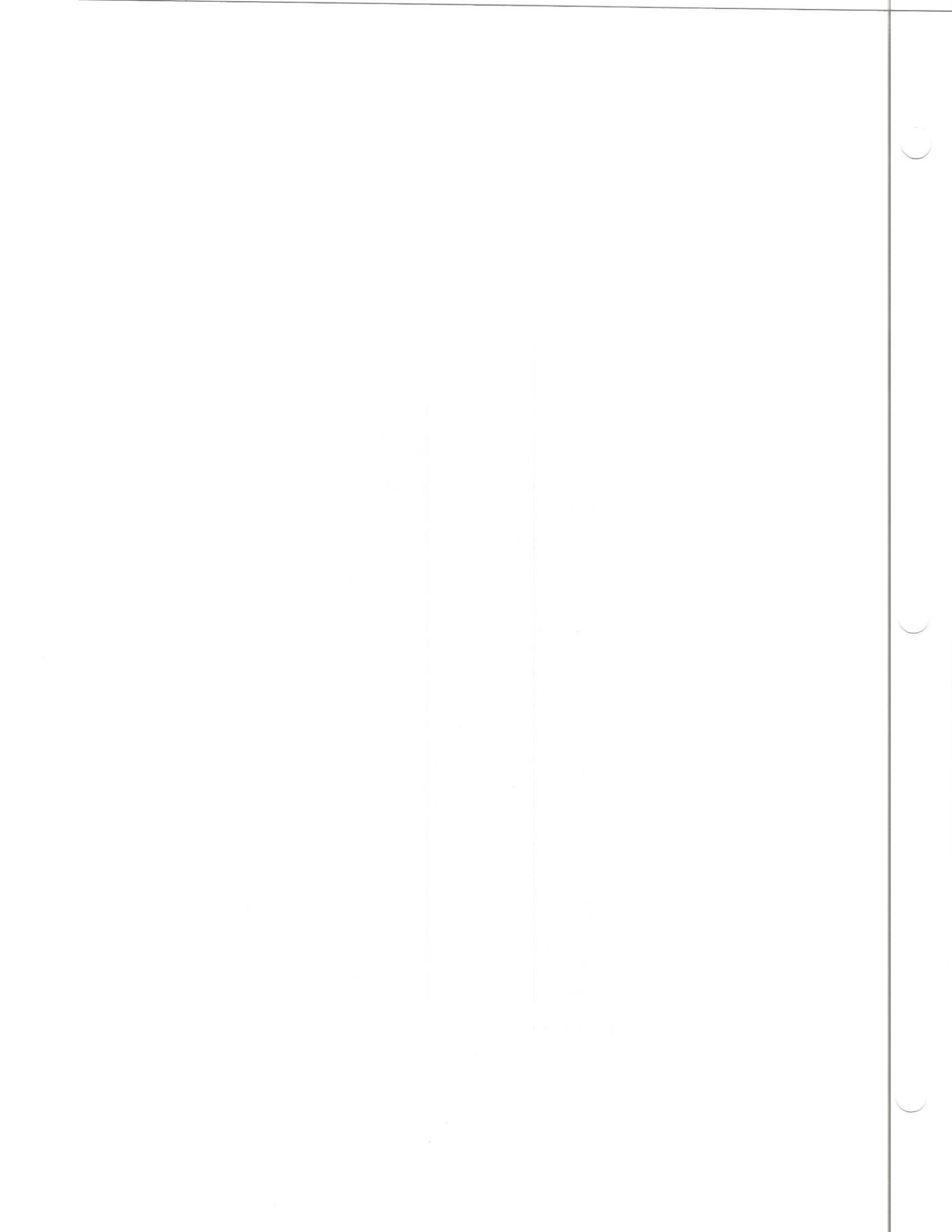
