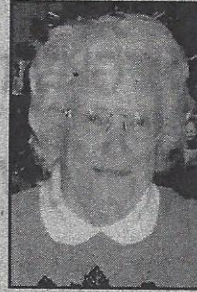


## Doris L. Grubbs

Preceding him in death were three siblings: sister Eva Gunter and brothers Donny Gunter and Gordon Gunter.

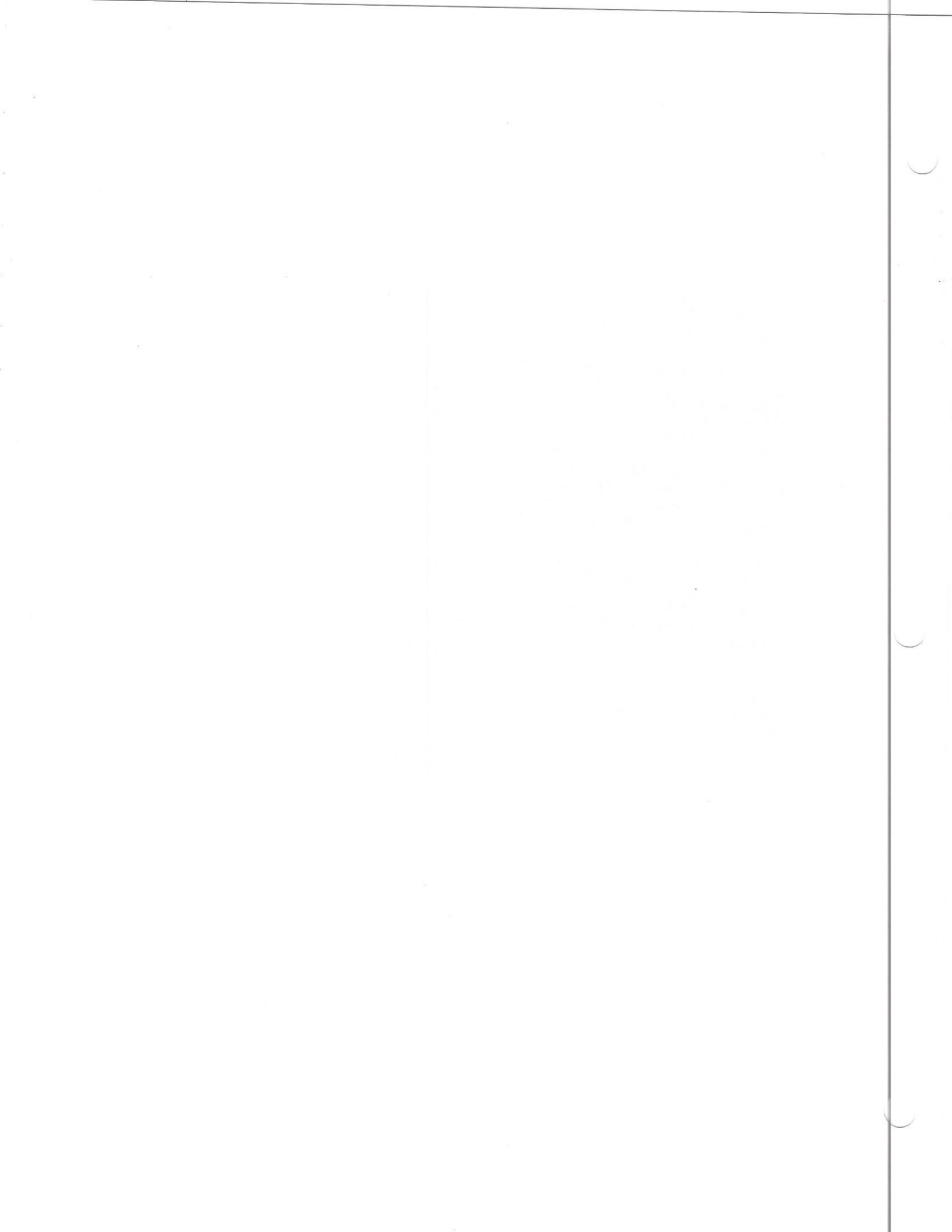

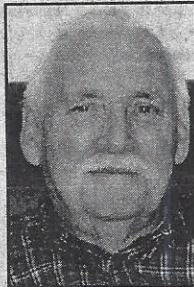
## Richard Gunter
