He was married on Aug. 2, 1965 in Rochester, to Charlotte "Dolly" Kindig; she survives.

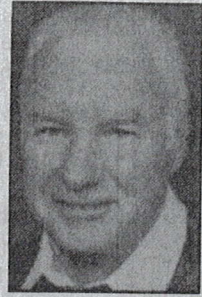
