## Dale E. Bradway

April 12, 1928 - Feb. 17, 2021

Dale E. Bradway, age 92, of Chapman Lake, passed away on Wednesday, Feb. 17, 2021, at 11 p.m. in Grace Village rehab, Winona Lake.

Born in Akron on April 12, 1928, he was the son of Chester and Mary Ellen (Clevenger) Bradway. He was one of eight Bradway children raised in the home and was a 1946 graduate of Akron High School. On March 21, 1948, Dale was united in marriage to Gloria Woods; the pair met while roller-skating in Warsaw when they literally collided on the skating floor. They shared nearly 70 years before Gloria passed on January 16, 2017.

Dale and Gloria made their home in the South Bend area in the early years. He worked for Drewey's as a transport driver and was proud to help start Boy Scout Troop 110 in Mishawaka. Later, they returned to the Warsaw area where they owned and operated Woodies Rental for more than 25 years. More personal-
